### Day 1 Athens Arachova Delphi Kalambaka




#### Tour Overview

After gathering in the morning, drive to Delphi, known as the "Navel of the World" and the "Center of the Earth". Visit the [Delphi Archaeological Site and Museum], where Zeus' two eagles met and Apollo established his temple. Stroll through the hills and valleys, immersed in the glory of ancient Greece. On the way, explore the [Arachova town], known as "Little Switzerland". Wander through the tranquil and winding streets of Arachova, where the snowy peaks are shrouded in mist, making you feel as if you've stepped into Switzerland. Overnight in or near Kalambaka.

**\*\*\*Note\*\*\***

Due to unforeseen natural events, a landslide near Arachova town has led to a road closure. Currently, there is no official date for when the road will reopen. If the road remains closed, the original itinerary, which includes a visit to Arachova town, will be affected. If the road is open and safe on the scheduled day, the original itinerary will proceed as planned. However, if the road remains closed on the scheduled day, the itinerary will be adjusted to include a visit to the Thermopylae Archaeological Site—the monument commemorating King Leonidas of ancient Sparta and his 300 warriors—on the return journey to Athens the following day.

### **[Acropolis open-air ancient theater]**

The magical effect of the Dionysius Theatre in the Acropolis complex is its acoustics. At the edge of the huge semi-circular theater, the audience can still hear the sighs of the actors as clearly as the audience in the front row. The theater has been in use for 2000 years and is still in use today.

### **[Mountain gate]**

Translated into Propylaei, built between 437 and 432 BC, the architect Mnesicles, located on the steep slope of the west end of the Acropolis, is the entrance to the Acropolis, in order to adapt to local conditions, to create an asymmetrical form.

### **[Goddess of Victory, Athena Niki]**

The Temple of Athena Nike was built between 449 and 421 BC. It is also known as the Temple of Athena Victory, the Temple of Niki, the Temple of Wingless Victory, located on the Acropolis Hill. It adopts the Ionian column type. The base is 8.15 meters long and 5.38 meters wide. The front and rear colonnades are exquisitely carved. It is the architectural art of the Dorians and Ionians who lived in Athens. In the eyes of the Greeks, Athena is the goddess who represents wisdom, skill and victory.

### **[Parthenon]**

In the center of the ancient castle in the Greek capital of the Acropolis, on the hills of limestone, there is a winding rectangular building, the temple stands at the highest point of the Acropolis, which is the famous Parthenon in the world art treasure house. Temple, also known as the Parthenon. This temple has undergone more than two thousand years of vicissitudes. Now the temple has collapsed, the statue has disappeared, and the relief has been severely eroded. However, from the colonnade standing still, you can see the richness of the temple. The Parthenon is also translated as "Batnong Temple" and is the most important main building of the Acropolis. The name of the Parthenon is from the Athena's nickname Parthenon, the Greek Παρθενωσ, which means "virgin". On the column, the Parthenon is adopted by the Parthenon.

### **[Dionysus Amphitheatre]**

The Dionysos Theater in Athens is located on the south side of the Acropolis. It has two semi-circular theaters connected by a porch, which fully reflects the ancient Greeks' love of art. The Odium of Herodes Attius Theatre on the west side is still used as a venue for summer open-air concerts and theatre performances, and the Bacchus Theatre on the east side is open to visitors as an attraction. The theater was built in the 5th century BC and was the first place to pray to Dionysus.

### Tour Overview

After breakfast, we set off to explore Greece's "Sky City"—Meteora, where we admire the 14th century monastery complex and witness how six monasteries perch atop towering cliffs. Overnight in or near Athens.

### [Nafplio]

One of the most beautiful towns in the area of Argolis (in eastern Peloponnese) as well as one of the most romantic cities all over Greece, Nafplio was the first capital of the newly born Greek state between 1823 and 1834. According to mythology, the town was founded by Nafplios, the son of god Poseidon and the daughter of Danaus (Danaida) Anymone.

### [Corinth Canal]

The Corinth Canal is an artificial canal in Greece that connects the Gulf of Corinth in the Ionian Sea with the Saronic Gulf in the Aegean Sea. It cuts through the narrow Isthmus of Corinth and separates the Peloponnese from the Greek mainland, making the peninsula an island. The canal was dug through the Isthmus at sea level and has no locks. It is 6.4 kilometres (4 miles) in length and only 24.6 metres (80.7 feet) wide at sea level.

### [Palamidi Fortress]

Palamidi is a fortress to the east of the Acronauplia in the town of Nafplio in the Peloponnese region of southern Greece. It is a typical baroque fortress based on the plans of Venetian engineer Antonio Giancix and built by French military engineer Pierre de la Salle. When the Greeks overthrew the Turks the bastions were renamed after ancient Greek leaders and heroes.

## Day 3 Athens Santorini



### Tour Overview

After breakfast, take a ferry from Piraeus Port in Athens to Santorini Island (the sailing time usually ranges from 07:25 to 14:50, depending on the specific schedule of the ferry company). Upon arrival at [Santorini Island] in the afternoon, head to [Oia] to enjoy the sunset. The blue sky and ocean create a vast backdrop, while white houses perched on towering cliffs stand silently, waiting for every sunrise and sunset over the Aegean Sea.

## Day 4 Santorini



### Tour Overview

Enjoy the stunning scenery of Santorini all day. [5-Hour Sailing Cruise with Meals Included](Optional) Sail across the crystal-clear waters of Santorini to reach the famous Red Beach, known for its breathtaking and dramatic scenery, and then head to the beautiful White Beach. Visit the unique Black Mountain, formed naturally after a volcanic eruption. After sailing close to the Venetian Lighthouse, the next stop will be the Volcano of Nea Kameni and the hot springs, where you can enjoy swimming, fishing, and dining while taking in the wild scenery and the volcanic atmosphere. You can also try diving or snorkeling in the clear blue waters. Snorkeling equipment is available on board. Afterwards, a fresh meal will be served, featuring local seafood and barbecue. An open bar will also be available, offering beverages. Before heading back to port and ending the tour, enjoy the mesmerizing views of Santorini and the clear waters of the Aegean Sea. (In winter, if swimming is not possible, the tour will typically arrange a visit to the volcanic island.) [Black Beach] Santorini's unique volcanic geology has created the distinctive black sand beach at Kamari. The long black sand beach was formed from volcanic ash deposited after eruptions and is a popular vacation spot on the eastern side of Santorini. [Active Volcano](Optional) Take a boat tour to the active volcano, where you can hike up to see the smoking crater and enjoy the natural hot springs in the volcanic sea before returning. Those who choose not to participate can enjoy free time in Fira. [Fira] Enjoy your free time wandering around Fira, a town full of restaurants, bars, and various shops. You can visit the blue-domed churches or relax in a café while enjoying the sea breeze and the fairy-tale scenery. Overnight in Santorini.

**The order of the tours will be arranged according to the situation.**

**Note: When participating in the volcano tour:** It is recommended to bring a bath towel and wear swimwear in advance, as there are no changing rooms on board. Guests who cannot swim should stay on the boat to enjoy the scenery and avoid jumping into the hot springs. Do not wear slippers, as the volcanic rocks on the island are hot and rough. The temperature on the island is high and there are no shops, so please bring bottled water.

### [Santorini volcanic island]

The crater of Santorini is a large, largely flooded crater located in the southern Aegean Sea, 120 km north of Crete, Greece. It is visible above the water ring of Santorini archipelago, including the largest island of Santorini (Thera), surrounded by Therasia, Asp Ronnie West Island, is the center of Nea Kameni.

### [Santorini black sand beach]

The black sands of Santorini are actually formed by magma stones during the eruption of the volcano. Kamari Beach is the best place to swim, the sea is clean and clear, and it is said to have a cosmetic effect. However, there are stones on the beach and it is not convenient to walk. The night here is the reason why this beach is famous. In the evening, the bars and restaurants are very lively. Many bars have live bands, dance floors and huge screens to watch the game.

## Day 5 Santorini Athens





### Tour Overview

After breakfast, head to the highest point on Santorini, where the island's first monastery is located, offering breathtaking views. Then visit [Pyrgos], which was the capital of Santorini until the early 19th century and is home to many exquisite Byzantine buildings and magnificent churches. After lunch, take a ferry back to Athens. (The sailing time is generally from 15:30 to 23:25, depending on the ferry company's specific schedule).

**Fira (FIRA) town**

**[Fira (FIRA) town]**

Fira (also known as Thira) is the capital of the Greek island of Aegean, Santorini, a traditional residential settlement. The town has convenient transportation and many hotels. From here, there are direct buses to the towns of Oia, Black Beach and Red Beach. It can be said that it is the transit bus stop of Holy Island. Every season in July, August and September is basically crowded with tourists, many of whom are just married newcomers, come here for honeymoon, super romantic. The town is not big, it is very suitable for walking slowly. The layout of the town's alleys is exquisite, criss-crossing, up and down. The alleys are full of small shops selling traditional costumes, handicrafts, gold and silver jewellery, as well as many family-run small restaurants and cafes.

## Day 6 Athens



**Tour Overview**



After breakfast, visit the [Acropolis], an ancient citadel located on a rocky outcrop above the city of Athens. It contains the remains of several ancient buildings of great architectural and historical significance, including the Parthenon, the Temple of Athena Nike, the Theatre of Dionysus Eleuthereus, and the Erechtheion. Afterward, visit [Syntagma Square] [Hellenic Parliament] [Tomb of Unknown Soldier], and witness the [Changing of the Guard Ceremony]. And finally you can enjoy some free time in the old town [PLAKA], incorporating labyrinthine streets and neoclassical architecture. It is known as the "Neighborhood of the Gods" due to its proximity to the Acropolis and its many archaeological sites.
