Tour Overview

In the morning, we drive to Slovakia and visit [Banska bystrica]. The 15th and 16th centuries are considered to be a “golden age” in the history of Banská Bystrica. It was the time, when the Thurzo-Fugger Copper Company successfully operated here and Bystrica got an attribute “Copper city”. Historic centre of Banská Bystrica consists of many architectural gems from that period. And we will visit the [Slovak National Uprising Square], stroll through the medieval streets, and enjoy a special lunch (optional) in the local specialty underground wine cellar restaurant. Overnight stay in Krakow or nearby.

Cesky Krumlov

[Cesky Krumlov]

Krumlov (also known as CK Town) is a peach blossom source in Europe, a small red town left by the Bohemian kingdom. Surrounded by the vast Vltava River, the castle-centered medieval city on the other side of the river valley is boundless, and the red tile houses are full of ups and downs. On the outskirts of the town, you can see the most obvious landmark of Krumlov, the castle tower.

Day 2 Krakow 🚗 Auschwitz 🚗 Warsaw



Tour Overview

After breakfast, we will head to Krakow, the city of Kings on the UNESCO World Heritage List. On the vast [Main Square], florists reign supreme and carriage horses tap their hooves. Doves and pigeons soar over the impressive [St. Mary's Basilica]. Not far from the square is the [Jagiellonian University], the oldest university in Poland and one of the oldest universities in continuous operation in the world. Then we go to the Polish town of Auschwitz to visit [Auschwitz concentration camp (Auschwitz II-Birkenau)] (exterior visit only), which was the largest of the German Nazi concentration camps and extermination centers. Over 1.1 million men, women and children lost their lives here. The post-camp relics are protected by the Museum created in 1947. The Memorial today is i.a. the Archive and Collections as well as research, conservation and publishing center. Overnight stay in Warsaw or nearby.

[Austrian Parliament Building]

The Austrian Parliament Building in Vienna is the seat of the Austrian National Assembly and the Austrian Federal Parliament.

[Schonbrunn Palace]

The Schönbrunn Palace is named after a spring, which was originally an open green space. Once the Emperor Matthias had hunt for this, drinking a spring water and refreshing his heart, he called this spring a beautiful spring. In 1743, Queen Mary G. Teresia ordered the establishment of a palace here, where there were magnificent palaces and baroque gardens. It covers an area of 26,000 square meters, second only to the French Palace of Versailles, and is the second largest palace in Europe.

[Stephen's Cathedral]

Stephen's Cathedral is a symbol of the city of Vienna and one of the most famous Gothic churches in the world. Its 137-meter-tall minaret is the second tallest church spire in the world after Cologne Cathedral. The high dome, the baroque and elaborate altar, is unforgettable. Carved gorgeous marble columns. The magnificent building, with its colorful glass, makes people feel sacred. Visitors can also climb the South Tower of the Cathedral and take the elevator to see the Pomeran clock, which overlooks the city of Vienna.

[Hofburg Imperial Palace]

The Hofburg Imperial Palace is the palace of the Habsburg dynasty in Austria and is located in the heart of the capital, Vienna. From 1275 to 1913, after many reconstructions and reconstructions, it finally evolved into a maze of 18 wings, 19 courtyards and 2,500 rooms. In the six exhibition halls of the Princess Sissi Museum, there are a large number of replicas of the royal palace and some costumes, which can be used to trace the life of the Princess Sissi.

[Budweiser Town]

Bujejovice is the capital of the Czech Republic of South Bohemia, the home of Budweiser, and the old town is full of wonderful Baroque architecture. Since the 13th century, the area has been known for brewing beer. Budweiser beer originated from it, so it is also known as Budweiser town. There is a charming medieval old town with a central square in the old town, surrounded by beautiful buildings of Baroque and Renaissance style. On both sides of the street are well-preserved medieval-style buildings that vary in shape and color but are coordinated.

Day 3 Warsaw 🚆 Wrocław



Tour Overview

After breakfast, we will go to Warsaw, the capital of Poland. Situated right in the heart of Europe, at the intersection of Europe's east-west and north-south transport routes, Warsaw is major economic, academic, cultural and tourist hub with a dazzling array of historical sites. Visit the stunning Baroque [Royal Castle], the official residence of Polish kings from the 16th Century onwards. In the very heart of Warsaw stands the phenomenal [Palace of Culture and Science], built in an Art Deco-meets-Stalinism style, and has become a modern icon of the city. Towering over 230 metres into the sky, it is visible from practically every corner of the capital. An unbeatable panorama of Warsaw can be viewed from the observation deck on the 30th floor. Overnight stay in Wrocław or nearby.

[Fisherman Bastion]

Fisherman's Bastion is a neo-Gothic and neo-Roman-style viewing platform located on the Castle Hill on the Danube River on the Buda side of Budapest, Hungary, near the Matthias Church. It was built between 1895 and 1902, and the designer was Frij Schuler during the Second World War, and the Fisherman's Bastion was almost destroyed. Between 1947 and 1948, the son of Frij Schulek, Janos Schulek, was in charge of the restoration project. From the tower and the observation deck, you can see the Danube, Margaret Island, Pace in the east, and the panoramic view of the Gellé Hills.

[Buda Castle]

Located on the west bank of the Danube on the Castle Hill in Budapest, it is one of Budapest's landmarks. It was once the residence of the Hungarian royal family. The central part of the palace has been changed to the Budapest History Museum, the National Library and the National Gallery. It is open to the public. .

[Roland Fountain]

The Roland Fountain and the square in the center of the old town of Bratislava were built around 1572 to celebrate the coronation of the Maximilian King.

[Matthias Church]

The Matthias Church is located along the Danube River on the Fisherman's Bastion side. The crowning of the Hungarian kings is one of the landmarks of Castle Hill. The bright colors, stone spires, colorful mosaic roofs, Hungarian folklore, Art Nouveau style and Turkish style are all fascinating against the blue sky. As described by Hugo, the Matthias Church is a "symphony of stone."

Continue your exploration with a visit to [Old Town Square], the heart of Prague's historic center, where you'll find the famous [Prague Astronomical Clock]. Then you can experience [Vltava River Cruise] (optional). Overnight stay in Prague or nearby.

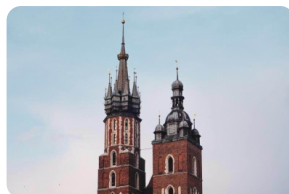
The largest medieval square in Europe is also the most exciting place in Krakow.

[St. Mary's Church]

Built in the 14th century, a brick Gothic church in the Polish city of Krakow is known for its Gothic wooden altar.

[Jagiellon University]

The Neo-Gothic building, built at the end of the 19th century, is not only sleek, but also has an intrinsic structure. The multi-pleated arched doors and the geometrically aggregated ceilings are full of fun and beauty. Jagiellonian University is one of the oldest universities in Poland. The famous alumni are the astronomers Copernicus, Pope Paul II and the famous Polish poet Sinboska. The Nobel trophy of Sinboska is still in the school library.

Day 5 Prague Krumlov Budějovice



Tour Overview

After breakfast, we depart for [Cesky Krumlov]. Český Krumlov does not boast of its inscription on the UNESCO World Heritage List for nothing. Spectacular collection of buildings, mainly from the 16th century, winds around the meanders of the Vltava River. Overnight stay in Budějovice or nearby.



Auschwitz concentration camp [Auschwitz concentration camp]

The Auschwitz concentration camp is located in Auschwitz, southwest of Krakow. It was one of the German labor camps and extermination camps established in Poland during World War II. It has now become a famous memorial and museum. There are two camps in the area, a larger Auschwitz concentration camp and a smaller Auschwitz-Birkenau second camp. The two places are about 3 km away. There is a free shuttle bus to and from the two camps every hour. between.

Day 6 Budějovice Vienna



Tour Overview

After breakfast, we will visit [České Budějovice], a city with over 750 years of tradition, numerous impressive heritage sites and breathtaking countryside all around. It's famous for the Budweiser Budvar Brewery. Afterwards, we'll drive to Vienna, a city renowned for its rich cultural heritage, imperial history, and reputation as the "capital of music". We'll explore the imperial summer residence of [Schönbrunn Palace](optional) and [Austrian Parliament], symbolizing Austria's political history. Next, we'll visit [Stephansdom], known for its striking tiled roof and panoramic views of the city from the tower, and [Hofburg Palace], housing the offices of the Austrian president and various museums. Overnight stay in Vienna or nearby.

[Warsaw Old Town]

It has gathered a variety of historical monuments, places of interest, especially magnificent palaces, huge churches, various kinds of arrow towers, castles and so on. The Old Town Market Square is the heart of Warsaw's Old Town. It is surrounded by Gothic buildings. There is a fountain for the mermaid statue in the middle. The mermaid with the sharp edge and shield is the symbol of Warsaw.

[Royal palace castle]

Built at the end of the 13th century, it is also known as the Warsaw Castle, which was originally a civil structure. The Warsaw Palace is a symbol of the historical traditions of Poland and a witness to the rise and fall of the nation.

Day 7 Vienna 🚗 Bratislava 🚗 Budapest



Tour Overview

After breakfast we travel to Bratislava, the capital of Slovakia, pass through the [Michael's Gate] to the Primate's Square with its ancient [Roland Fountain]. The Old Town Hall next to the square has now been converted into the Municipal Museum, and the St. Martin's Cathedral next to it witnessed the fall of the Roman Empire. Afterwards, we head to Budapest, the capital of Hungary. Enjoy a scenic [Danube River Cruise](optional) to admire the beautiful views along both banks. Afterwards, visit the [Fisherman's Bastion], an iconic terrace offering panoramic views of the city. We will also see the [Buda Castle], a former royal residence, and the [Matthias Church], renowned for its stunning architecture and vibrant history. In the evening, we end the tour at the Heroes' Square.

Prague Astronomical Clock

[Prague Square]

Prague is the capital of the Czech Republic and one of the most beautiful cities in Europe. Its most famous square is the Old Town Square. The center of the Old Town Square is the statue of Jan Hus. The most distinctive ancient building in the square is the self-timer. The name Prague is from German. It is called Braha, which means "threshold". The reason is that the Vltava River flows through a reef, and the water is rushing, just like crossing a threshold.

[Prague Astronomical Clock]

On the south wall of the old town hall, the astronomical clock gathers visitors from all over the world to stop and take photos to look at the clock that has been around for more than 600 years. The shape of the whole clock is very beautiful, according to the principle of the Earth Center of the year. The clock above circled around the day, the following year rounded around the week, every day at 12 noon, on the astronomical clock, the twelve beautiful Jesus disciples appeared in order from the side of the clock, six turned left, six Turn right. With a roar of the rooster, the window closes and the clock sounds.
