[Zurich Cathedral]

The Zurich Cathedral is one of the three main churches in Zurich, Switzerland (the other two are the Cathedral of Our Lady of Zurich and St. Peter's Church). The church is located near the banks of the Limmat River. Today's church was built around 1100 and was unveiled around 1220. According to legend, the earliest church was created for Charlemagne. The Zurich Cathedral is a monastery church that competes with the Cathedral of Our Lady of Zurich across the Limmat River in the Middle Ages. Charlemagne's mount stumbled in front of the tombs of the main saints Felix and Regula in Zurich. According to legend, it was earlier than the Cathedral of Our Lady, which was built by the grandson of Charlemagne. Recent archaeological evidence proves that this is the Roman cemetery.

[Lake Zurich]

Lake Zurich is the famous icy lake in Switzerland. The scenery of Lake Zurich is superb, with medieval pebble trails along the river for visitors to take a walk by the lake, swimming, picnicking, sunbathing and boat trips to the Lake District.

[Bahnhofstrasse]

Bahnhofstrasse in Zurich, Switzerland is the richest street in the world. The main street was built during the Roman rule in 15 BC and became one of the most prosperous and "expensive" streets in the city.

[Chapel Bridge]

Chapel Bridge is a covered wooden footbridge spanning the river Reuss diagonally in Lucerne. Named after the nearby St. Peter's Chapel, the bridge is unique in containing a number of interior paintings dating back to the 17th century, although many of them were destroyed along with a larger part of the centuries-old bridge in a 1993 fire. Subsequently restored, the Kapellbrücke is the oldest wooden covered bridge in Europe, as well as the world's oldest surviving truss bridge. It serves as the city's symbol and as one of Switzerland's main tourist attractions.

[Lion monument]

The dying Lusen lion is one of the most famous statues in the world, and the famous writer Mark Twain called it "the most tragic and touching statue in the world."

[Austrian Parliament Building]

The Austrian Parliament Building in Vienna is the seat of the Austrian National Assembly and the Austrian Federal Parliament.

[Schonbrunn Palace]

The Schönbrunn Palace is named after a spring, which was originally an open green space. Visitors can also climb the South Tower of the Cathedral and take the elevator to see the Pomeran clock, which overlooks the city of Vienna.

[Heroes Square]

Heroes' Square is the main square of Budapest, the capital of Hungary, at the end of Andrássy Avenue (listed as a World Heritage Site), adjacent to the city park. There are two important buildings around the square: the Museum of Fine Arts on the left and the Palace of Art on the right. The Serbian Embassy is also located here. At the heart of the Heroes' Square is the city's landmark, the Millennium Monument, engraved with seven tribal leaders who created Hungary in the 9th century, as well as statues of other Hungarian historical celebrities.

[Fisherman Bastion]

Fisherman's Bastion is a neo-Gothic and neo-Roman-style viewing platform located on the Castle Hill on the Danube River on the Buda side of Budapest, Hungary, near the Matthias Church. It was built between 1895 and 1902, and the designer was Frij Schuler during the Second World War, and the Fisherman's Bastion was almost destroyed. Between 1947 and 1948, the son of Frij Schulek, Janos Schuleck, was in charge of the restoration project. From the tower and the observation deck, you can see the Danube, Margaret Island, Pace in the east, and the panoramic view of the Gellé Hills.

[Buda Castle]

Located on the west bank of the Danube on the Castle Hill in Budapest, it is one of Budapest's landmarks. It was once the residence of the Hungarian royal family. The central part of the palace has been changed to the Budapest History Museum, the National Library and the National Gallery. It is open to the public. .

[Matthias Church]

The Matthias Church is located along the Danube River on the Fisherman's Bastion side. The crowning of the Hungarian kings is one of the landmarks of Castle Hill. The bright colors, stone spires, colorful mosaic roofs, Hungarian folklore, Art Nouveau style and Turkish style are all fascinating against the blue sky. As described by Hugo, the Matthias Church is a "symphony of stone."



[Semper Opera House]

[Zwinger Palace]

[Church of Our Lady]

[Berlin Cathedral]

Christian Lutheran Church, located at the eastern end of the Museum Island in central Berlin, Germany. It was once the court church of the Haus Hohenzollern in the German Empire.

[Museum Island]

Museum Island is located in the heart of Berlin and is made up of the New Museum, the Old National Gallery, the Pergamon Museum and the Bode Museum. It is known as the Museum Island because of the confluence of the two rivers on the River Spree.

[Berlin TV Tower]

Built between August 1965 and October 1969, the TV Tower is 368 meters high and is second to none in the country.

[Berlin Wall]

After the Second World War, the German capital of Berlin, the German Democratic Republic established a wall on its own territory, aimed at isolating East Germany and the Federal Republic of Germany. The establishment of the Berlin Wall was an important landmark for the German split and the Cold War after World War II.


