Next, continue to Nice to visit the [Pr omenade des Anglais]. Considered the capital of the Côte d' Azur, dynamic and colorful Nice is one of the most popular destinations for a city break in F rance, combining history and culture with mouth-watering gastronomy and a sweeping bay of turquoise sea. Prince's Palace of Monaco

[Prince's Palace of Monaco]

Built in the 13th century, the Prince's Palace of Monaco is located on the edge of the cliff. It is the seat of the government of Monaco. It is only open to the public when the prince is out. The visiting area includes the Royal Apartments (Grands Appartements), as well as the Napoleon Memorial Hall and the Royal Palace Historical Achievement Collection (Le Musée des Souvenirs Napoléonienset des Archives du Palais). The location of the Prince's Palace is unique, with exquisite frescoes, splendid decorations, the SainteMarie Bell Tower built of white rock and the Hall of Honor and twoway staircase built of marble. Around the Palace Square are display forts cast in the period of Louis XIV. From the square (northeast side), you can see the view of the port of Monte Carlo, Monaco. Every 11:55 noon is the time for the handover of the guards at the Palace Square.

[England Avenue]

The boulevard of England is the main promenade in Nice, as the first person to invest in the resort was named after the English, and palm trees were planted on both sides of the boulevard. The beach is different from Cannes in that it is a pebble beach.

Day 3 Cannes ■ Avignon ■ Grenoble

Tour Overview

After breakfast, head to Cannes, home to the world-famous Cannes Film Festi val, located in the Côte d'Azur. Visit iconic [Palais des Festivals] and [The Croi sette], an avenue renowned for its prestigious shops and the luxury hotels th at have established Cannes' history. Located in the heart of Provence, Avigno n has everything needed to enchant you with its art de vivre and rich archite ctural heritage. The largest Gothic palace in Europe and the epicenter of the city, the [Palais des Papes], was the residence of the papal sovereigns during the 14th century. Not far away is the [Avignon Cathedral], a Romanesque-sty le church known for its stunning architecture, beautiful frescoes, and the gol den statue of the Virgin Mary that crowns its bell tower. On the outskirts of the city, the world-famous [Pont d'Avignon] is another must-see historical landmark, a testament to the city's rich history. Overnight in Grenoble or near by.

[Festival Palace]

Built in 1982, it is the primary venue for the annual Cannes Film Festival, the Cannes Lions International Festival of Creativity, and the NRJ Music Awards.

[Pope palace]

Originally built in 1334, it covers an area of about 15,000 square meters and is the largest and most important medieval Gothic building in Europe. In 1906, the palace was transformed into a national museum. There are now more than 20 rooms to visit, including the Pope's room, and a review of historical events.

[Broken bridge]

It was first completed in 1185 and appeared in French nursery rhymes. It is 900 meters long and spans the Rhone River, connecting the Old Town with the New Town. In the 17th century, a flood washed the bridge, and only a part of the broken bridge survived to this day.

[Notre Dame Cathedral]

Rebuilt in the middle of the twelfth century, it is the oldest religious building in Avignon. The church has a bell tower with a total of 35 clocks. It is said that the sound of the French bell tower is the second loudest. Each bell has its own name. Because the size is different, the sound is different.

[Promenade]

The Promenade is the most fascinating attraction in Cannes. It is wide and tidy, with a sandy bay on one side and an elegant hotel on the other. The hotel's buildings are built in the last century and have very modern buildings. In the green belt in the middle of the street, there are flowers blooming all year round, and the vibrant palm trees in the sun add a charm to the town.

[Cannes]

In the movie paradise, the movie palace attracts countless movie lovers every year to take pictures. Every year in May, it is a superstar.

The flower clock is a famous attraction in Geneva. Switzerland is known as the "land of the garden" and at the same time it is the "hometown of watches and clocks" . What is even more amazing is that the skilled craftsmen of Switzerland perfectly combine the beauty of flowers with the craftsmanship of watches and clocks, creating a "flower clock" with ingenuity.

After breakfast, we head to Interlaken to take a look at the [Jungfraujoch] (op tional), often referred to as the "Top of Europe." It is one of Switzerland's mo st iconic peaks, offering stunning panoramic views of snow-covered mountains and glaciers. Located in the Bernese Alps, it is accessible via the Jungfraujo chrailway station, the highest in Europe, making it a popular destination for both adventure seekers and nature lovers. After the trip, we head to Lucerne and stay overnight in a hotel in or around Lucerne.

[Jungfraujoch]

It is the highest peak in Europe and the most fascinating landscape in the Bernese Oberland. It is known as the "Queen of the Alps". Jungfrau is 4158 meters above sea level and 18 kilometers across the river. It is like a young girl, dressed in long hair, wrapped in silver, lying on the back between the clouds.

[Chapel Bridge]

Chapel Bridge is a covered wooden footbridge spanning the river Reuss diagonally in Lucerne. Named after the nearby St. Peter's Chapel, the bridge is unique in containing a number of interior paintings dating back to the 17th century, although many of them were destroyed along with a larger part of the centuries-old bridge in a 1993 fire. Subsequently restored, the Kapellbrücke is the oldest wooden covered bridge in Europe, as well as the world's oldest surviving truss bridge. It serves as the city's symbol and as one of Switzerland's main tourist attractions.

[Lion monument]

The dying Lusen lion is one of the most famous statues in the world, and the famous writer Mark Twain called it "the most tragic and touching statue in the world."

After breakfast, head to Lucerne. The [Chapel Bridge], with its cycle of paintin gs, is the undisputed landmark of the city. It stretches from the New Town, p ast the water tower, to the Town Hall Quay. The path through the picturesque old town will lead you to another popular sight, the [Lion of Lucerne]. Next, proceed to Zurich to explore the city's landmarks: the [Grossmünster Church], [Bahnhofstrasse], and [Lake Zurich]. Then, we will continue to St. Gallen, where we will visit the [St. Gallen Abbey] and the [Abbey Library of Saint Gallen], both famous cultural heritage sites. After the trip, return to Munich.

[Zurich Cathedral]

The Zurich Cathedral is one of the three main churches in Zurich, Switzerland (the other two are the Cathedral of Our Lady of Zurich and St. Peter's Church). The church is located near the banks of the Limmat River. Today's church was built around 1100 and was unveiled around 1220. According to legend, the earliest church was created for Charlemagne. The Zurich Cathedral is a monastery church that competes with the Cathedral of Our Lady of Zurich across the Limmat River in the Middle Ages. Charlemagne's mount stumbled in front of the tombs of the main saints Felix and Regula in Zurich. According to legend, it was earlier than the Cathedral of Our Lady, which was built by the grandson of Charlemagne. Recent archaeological evidence proves that this is the Roman cemetery.

[Lake Zurich]

Lake Zurich is the famous icy lake in Switzerland. The scenery of Lake Zurich is superb, with medieval pebble trails along the river for visitors to take a walk by the lake, swimming, picnicking, sunbathing and boat trips to the Lake District.

[Bahnhofstrasse]

Bahnhofstrasse in Zurich, Switzerland is the richest street in the world. The main street was built during the Roman rule in 15 BC and became one of the most prosperous and "expensive" streets in the city.

[St. Gallen Abbey]

<u>St. Gallen Abbey</u> is located in St. Gallen, St. Gallen, Switzerland. As a typical representative of the Garolinian monastery, the monastery occupies an important position in the history of Western academic and <u>religious activities</u>. In 1983, it was included in the <u>World Heritage List</u> as a cultural heritage.
