## Day 2 Reykjavik Golden Circle South Coast




### Tour Overview

After breakfast, discover Iceland's stunning natural wonders on the Golden Circle! It is one of the most popular tourist routes in Iceland, encompassing three of the country's most spectacular natural attractions. You will explore the dramatic rift between two continents, learn about Viking history at [Thingvellir (Þingvellir) National Park], and marvel at the breathtaking geysers of the [Geysir Geothermal Area] and the magnificent [Gullfoss Waterfall]. After checking into your hotel for the night, during winter, you can venture out to search for the Northern Lights if the forecast is favorable.

**[Golden circle]**

The Golden Circle is the highlight of the Icelandic tour and includes three famous attractions, the former Parliament House, the Geysir Hot Spring Area and the Gullfoss.

**[Old site of the ancient parliament of Iceland (open-air parliament)]**

This is the site of the world's oldest democratic parliament, located next to a long, wide fault. This fault is the junction of the Eurasian plate and the American plate.

**[Geysir Geyser]**

Geysir , sometimes known as The Great Geysir, is a geyser in south-western Iceland, that geological studies suggest started forming about 1150 CE.

**[Gullfoss Waterfall]**

The name Gullfoss means "Golden Falls," and it's known for its powerful cascade. Gullfoss is fed by the Hvita River and plunges into a dramatic canyon, creating two distinct drops that total around 105 feet (32 meters) in height.

## Day 3 South Coast



### Tour Overview

We set out to explore Iceland's South Coast. To start, we'll drive to [Seljalandsfoss]. If the weather permits, you can walk behind the waterfall and see the cascade from the other side. Nearby stands [Skógafoss], which can be admired both from below and from the top after a climb of about 500 steps. Continuing our journey, we'll head to [Reynisfjara], a world-famous black sand beach with dramatic basalt sea stacks. After checking into your hotel for the night, during winter, you can venture out to search for the Northern Lights if the forecast is favorable.

### [Seljalandsfoss Waterfall]

The waterfall drops 60 m (197 ft) and is part of the Seljalands River that has its origin in the volcano glacier Eyjafjallajökull. Visitors can walk behind the falls into a small cave.

### [Vik Town]

Vik, at the southernmost tip of Iceland, is a quiet and peaceful town. Behind the town is the endless sea. The most famous attraction in the town of Vik is the black sand beach. In addition, you can also see a few islands in front of the sea that resemble the Beacon Hill in southern China. Because the earth is warming and the water level is rising, there are only a few hills left in the mountains of more than a century ago. A paradise for settlements.

### [Reynisfjara Black Sand Beach]

Reynisfjara is a world-famous black-sand beach found on the South Coast of Iceland, which features basalt columns and the dramatic Reynisdrangar sea stacks. The sand at Reynisfjara is black due to its volcanic origins. Formed from cooled lava that flowed into the ocean during eruptions, the lava fragments were broken down over time by the powerful waves, creating the distinctive black sand beach we see today.

### [Skogafoss]

Skógafoss is one of Iceland's biggest and most beautiful waterfalls with an astounding width of 25 meters (82 feet) and a drop of 60 meters (197 feet). Due to the amount of spray the cascade produces, at least one rainbow is present any time the sun emerges from behind the clouds.

## Day 4 South Coast 🚗 Jokulsarlon Glacier Lagoon



### Tour Overview

After breakfast, we'll head to Vatnajökull, the largest glacier in Iceland. Icebergs break off from the glacier's edge and crash into [Jökulsárlón Glacier Lagoon]. Nearby, you can stroll along [Diamond Beach], a stunning black sand beach famous for its large iceberg fragments. During the winter season (Nov to Mar), we'll visit the [Crystal Ice Cave]. Led by an expert glacier guide, you'll be able to safely explore and admire this extraordinary natural wonder. During the summer season (May- Oct), we will take an [Amphibian Boat Tour] of the glacier lagoon.



### Glacial lake

#### [Glacial lake]

The glacial lake was first formed around 1930. The glacial lake formed since the 1930s has reached more than 20 square kilometers and 200 meters deep. It is the second deep lake in Iceland. Many films have been photographed in Glacier Lake, including Tomb Raider, Batman Birth, and two 007 series films, Who and Fighting, and Iron and Steel Fighting.

## Day 5 Reykjavik Blue Lagoon



### Tour Overview

Reykjavik is a fantastic destination for tourists looking to experience the beauty and wonder of Iceland. Visit [Lake Tjörninn], [Parliament Square], the famous landmark [Hallgrímskirkja Church], [Perlan], and the [Harpa Concert Hall]. The highlight of the day is your time at the [Blue Lagoon] (optional), with its milky blue water rich in minerals, offering great healing benefits for the skin and providing the perfect way to relax.

Note: The Blue Lagoon ticket is for Comfort admission (towel rental, silica mud mask, and the first drink of your choice included), and availability is limited. We highly recommend booking in advance. Tickets are non-refundable. If the tickets are sold out, we will inform guests and process a refund. Reservations are not allowed on special holidays. Since the Blue Lagoon prices are listed in Icelandic Króna, our company converts them based on a fixed exchange rate. If this is a concern, please make your own reservation. 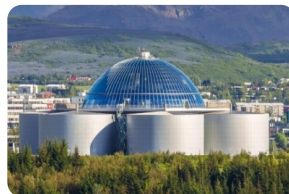

### [Blue lake]

This hot spring lake, which has become the spokesperson of Iceland, is the "world's largest outdoor seawater hot spring" and a top health resort. Iceland is a multi-volcanic country, and the Blue Lake is one of the most frequent areas of underground magma activity on Earth. The annual temperature of the lake is around 39-40 °C, even if it rains and snows, it will not be affected at all. The white SiO<sub>2</sub> in Blue Lake is a natural beauty product that can be applied to the face to lubricate clean skin.

### [Parliament square]

The statue of the character in the middle of the square is the father of Iceland, the father of Iceland who led the Icelandic people to gain independence from the Danish rule after a long struggle. Iceland's National Day is determined by his birthday.

### [Toning Lake]

Due to the good natural habitat around Toning Lake, there are more than 20 species of birds that inhabit and breed here, including ducks, seagulls and swans. The corner of the lake is the Reykjavik City Hall, which was built in 1992.

### [Hallgrims Church]

Here is the "highest building in Iceland". On the square in front of the church stands the statue of the explorer Leif Eriksson, who is the first Icelandic maritime adventurer in the world to discover the American continent, discovering the American continent more than 400 years earlier than Columbus. .

### [Pearl House]

It is a symbol of Reykjavik by using six huge hot water storage tanks to rebuild water storage, restaurants, bars, exhibition halls and observation decks.

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**Day 6** Snæfellsnes 🏠 Reykjavik

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**Tour Overview**



If you do not want to visit the Snæfellsnes Peninsula Tour, we will depart for Keflavik International Airport at 6 am. If you want to, we will head to the Snæfellsnes peninsula and experience the stunning natural beauty and breathtaking imagery. Here, you will find one of the peninsula's most iconic and photographed landmarks, Kirkjufell Mountain (also known as The Church Mountain). It became famous after being featured as the "Arrowhead Mountain" in Game of Thrones. The mountain's unique shape was formed by the erosive powers of glaciers during the last Ice Age, about 12,000 years ago. Next, we will visit Lóndrangar, a pair of striking rock pinnacles. Then, we will arrive at Arnarstapi, a tiny fishing village known for its picturesque coastal cliffs, formed from glowing magma colliding with the wild waves of the Atlantic. It is regarded as the most beautiful harbor in Iceland. Finally, we will reach Búðakirkja, a quaint church that sits alone amid a field of lava rocks. Afterward, return to Reykjavik city. \*\*\*Note: The Snæfellsnes Peninsula tour on this day is only available for guests who drop off at the Harpa Concert Hall parking lot. If you choose to drop off on Day 6 at the hotel or at Keflavik International Airport, the Snæfellsnes Peninsula tour will not be included.
