1 Frankfurt Rüdesheim Heidelberg Southern Germany




Tour Overview

In the morning, depart for Rhine Valley. Located on the right bank of the Rhine, [Rüdesheim am Rhein] is a German winemaking town and part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site in this region. It has a picturesque old town and famous for its romanticism along the Rhine. You can take a cruise on the Rhine River(optional). Next, head towards Heidelberg. We'll visit [Heidelberg University Square], explore [Heidelberg Castle], renowned for its stunning architecture and rich cultural heritage. You can also experience the historical charm of Heidelberg [Old Bridge]. Overnight in a southern town of Germany.

[Ruedesheim]

The wine country of Ruedesheim is situated on a gentle hillside with dense forests on the banks of the river. The city is full of overlapping red roofs and hidden streets of green trees, soaked with flowers and sparkling sunlight. Everything in the small town is small and exquisite, small wine lanes, small museums, small train stations, and the statue of the Little Germanicia—only the vineyards are large and large. The vineyards change color as the seasons change, and the picturesque villages are hidden in the vineyards, each of which is an old story.

[Alte Brücke]

The ancient bridge of Heidelberg, also known as Karl-Theodor-Brucke, is located in Heidelberg, Germany. It was built in 1896 and has a history of more than 200 years.

[Heidelberg Castle]

Heidelberg Castle is situated on the top of the King's throne, with many historical sites and historically expanded several times to form a mixture of Gothic, Baroque and Renaissance styles, a masterpiece of the German Renaissance. The main entrance of the castle is carved with armored warriors, the central garden has a fountain and four granite columns, surrounded by concert halls, glass halls and other buildings. Most of the rooms in the ancient city are open to visitors, and some well-preserved halls are still available for banquets and art performances. The “big barrel” and the large wine cellar that can store 220,000 liters of wine in the fort are the most attractive attractions in Heidelberg.

[Heidelberg University Square]

Founded in 1386, Heidelberg University is the first in Germany and the third oldest university in Europe. It has 18 colleges in theology, law, medicine, philosophy and 32,000 students from more than 80 countries.

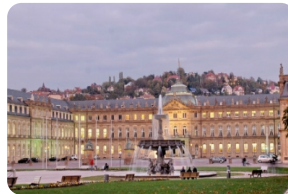
Tour Overview

[Meiqinggen Famous Village]

The success of the famous Metzingen Village originated from the old brick factory of the Canal Street in the 1970s: the textile center and the home of Hugo Boss. With an average annual reception of more than 3 million visitors from 185 countries, the Metzingen Village is one of the most successful factory direct sales cities in Europe. This is not without reason, because there is no place like the Metzingen Famous Village, which successfully combines fashion, lifestyle, design, food and high-end shopping environment with modern architectural style, and looks forward to fashion. [Stuttgart new palace]

The new palace is full of French style. The palace was originally a royal palace, and the central part of the palace is now the venue for state government events. The two wings are the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Culture, and the White Hall, one of the most beautiful concert halls in Stuttgart.

[Palace Square]

It is the largest square in the center of Stuttgart. The southeast side is the new royal palace built between 1746 and 1807, and the northwest side is the classic kingdom building.

[Hohenzollen Castle]

Hohenzollern Castle (German: Burg Hohenzollern) is located in Baden-Württemberg, Germany, and is known as the two castles of southern Germany in Neuschwanstein, Bavaria. It is the ruling family of the Kingdom of Prussia and the Second Empire of Germany. - The birthplace of the Hohenzollern family. The original Hohenzollern castle was built in the 11th century but was later destroyed. The existing castle was rebuilt between 1850 and 1867 and is one of the most majestic castle buildings in Germany and is regarded as a masterpiece in the 19th century fortress art. Outside of Germany, Hohenzollern Castle is also among the top five in Europe and the top ten castles in the world.

Day 3 Southern Germany 🚗 Königssee 🚗 Munich



Tour Overview

After breakfast, depart for Lake Königsee. Enjoy a scenic [boat ride] (optional), with a stop at the picturesque [St. Bartholomew's Church]. The church, located on a small peninsula, is known for its striking red domes and beautiful setting amidst the mountains. Next, head to the Bavarian capital, Munich, for a city tour. Begin at [Marienplatz], the central square, where you can admire the impressive [New and Old Town Halls]. Then, visit the [BMW World] and the [BMW Museum] (optional), offering an immersive journey through BMW's history, cutting-edge innovations, and a showcase of their latest vehicles. Over night in Munich or nearby.

[Neuschwanstein]

Neuschwanstein has undoubtedly become a business card for German tourism. It is a famous castle in Germany with many tourists. It is located in the Alps on the southern border of Germany, on a hilltop nearly a kilometer high. This Ludwig II has a masterpiece of national strength, with fairy-tale looks and scenery. The interior of Neuschwanstein is also extremely graceful, but after all, it is impossible to cover up the tragic fate of Ludwig II. There is a Marien Bridge on the foothills behind Neuschwanstein Castle, from which you can see the panoramic view of Swan Castle.

[Drip Lake]

Drip Lake: Located in the Black Forest, sitting quietly by the lake, watching the flowing lake, feeding a few ducks, feeling the flow of time. Ordering a Black Forest cake at a fine coffee shop is a wonderful experience!

[Marianne Bridge]

Connected to the two mountains south of Neuschwanstein, across the valley and the waterfall, it is the best location for shooting Neuschwanstein Castle, where the classic silhouette of Neuschwanstein is filmed. (This bridge has been recently repaired and has been enclosed. The opening hours are currently pending)

[Alpine lake]

The Alps Lake is located between the mountains of Neuschwanstein and the southwest of Hohenschwangau, about 5 km in circumference and surrounded by jungle. There are many wild swan inhabiting the lake.

Day 4 Munich 🚆 Rothenburg 🚆 Nuremberg



Tour Overview

After breakfast, head to Rothenburg, where you'll take a leisurely stroll through the Old Town. Visit the [Rothenburg Town Hall], an example of medieval architecture with its impressive façade. Then, explore the [St.Jakob's Church], known for its beautiful Gothic design and the famous altar. Continue to the [Rothenburg City Walls], which offer a glimpse into the city's historical defense structures. Overnight in Nuremberg or nearby.

[Passion theater]

Located on the north side of the town, the Martyr's Theatre is one of the most ambitious buildings in the city. It is famous for its crucifixes with a mantissa of 0 (eg 1990, 2000, 2010, 2020). The town's residents are involved in making costumes and Props. This tradition originated in the 17th century and described the achievements of Jesus before and after the suffering, in order to commemorate the ravages of the town from the plague. You can also visit in the year when the play is not performed.

[St. Peter and Paul Church]

Built in 1735-1749, St. Peter and Paul Church is an example of a Baroque-style church building in southern Germany. The west side has a common onion top in South Germany, and the interior is very beautiful.

[Zugspitze]

Germany's highest peak, 2,962 meters above sea level, can take the cog railway or cable car to the top, and around the Zugspitze is also very suitable for skiing and hiking.

Day 5 Nuremberg  Berlin



Tour Overview

After breakfast we will head to Germany's capital, Berlin. Explore the [Berlin Cathedral](Exterior visit only), a stunning baroque-style church with a large dome and rich history. Continue your tour with a view of [Museum Island](Exterior visit only), home to several world-renowned museums, showcasing treasures from ancient civilizations. Next, see the towering [Berlin TV Tower](Exterior visit only), one of the tallest structures in Europe. Finally, visit the historic [Berlin Wall], the barrier that once divided East and West Berlin during the Cold War. Several remnants of the Wall still stand, serving as a powerful reminder of the city's divided past. Overnight in Berlin or nearby.

[Königssee]

Königssee is located 5 km south of the small town of Berchtesgaden on the German-Austrian border. It is a narrow and beautiful lake eroded by glaciers. It is like a northern fjord and the lake is clear. The lake is like a mirror, Bishengmeiyu, surrounded by mountains, and the mountains are steep. It feels like a giant who is in the mountains and crosses the boat. It is like a fairyland. It is known as the most beautiful lake in Germany. . It is said that the name of King Lake is derived from the surrounding mountains, one like a king, one like a queen, the middle of the hill is their children, and there is a witch peak lying in the distance.

[Kehlsteinhaus]

The Kehlsteinhaus is located at 1,881 meters above sea level in the Alps near Berchtesgaden in southern Bavaria, Germany. It was built in 1938 by Martin Bowman as a villa for Hitler's 50th birthday. Hitler used it as a hospitality for important guests. Hitler had been to the "Eagle Nest" about 10 times, and most of the stays were less than 30 minutes. In 1945, the Allied forces bombed the "Eagle's Nest" but it was not damaged. Today, the "Eagle's Nest" has become an important tourist destination.

Day 6 Berlin Lübeck Hamburg



Tour Overview

After breakfast, depart for Lübeck to visit [St. Mary's Church], a brick Gothic church, one of Lübeck's main landmarks. Next, head to Hamburg, where you will visit [Hamburg City Hall], which offers a fascinating glimpse into the city's political and historical past. Not far away is [Alster Lake], a picturesque spot in the center of Hamburg, the lake offers a serene atmosphere. Next, explore [Salzspeicher], a UNESCO World Heritage site, known for its historic red-brick warehouses, canals, and cobblestone streets. Overnight in Hamburg or nearby.

[Munich City Hall]

The new Munich City Hall is a brown-black Gothic building on the north side of the Marienplatz, built at the end of the 19th century, with a layer of hoarfrost. Its front window walls are adorned with statues of Kings, saints and mythical heroes. The entire building is magnificent and decorative, and it took 40 years to complete it since 1867.

[Nymphenburg Palace]

Nymphenburg Palace is located in the west of Munich, built in 1675. In 1644, the prince Ferdinand Maria was happy. To celebrate the birth of the little prince, Wang Hou and his wife ordered the construction of this summer palace in the west of Munich. After more than 300 years of construction, the original ornamental garden has been expanded into a luxurious palace, with baroque gardens, shuttle channels and dotted pavilions. It is a good place to recommend while walking around.

[Maria Square]

Marienplatz is the central square of Munich. In the middle of the square is the statue of the Virgin Mary, and the north side of the square is the Gothic building of the City Hall built in 1867-1908.

[BMW World]

It is a comprehensive multi-purpose building integrating new car delivery center, technology and design studio, gallery, youth classroom and leisure bar.

Day 7 Hamburg 🚗 Göttingen 🚗 Frankfurt



Tour Overview

After breakfast, we will go to Göttingen, a city full of historical charm, famous for its historic university and fascinating architecture. Not only numerous Nobel prize winners, but also many other celebrities, like Gauss, Oppenheimer once lived and worked here. We will visit [University of Göttingen], which was built in 1734 and is one of the oldest universities in Europe. Wandering around the university, you can feel the solemn academic atmosphere. The [Old Town] is the soul of Göttingen, and the city hall and St. Jacobi's Church have witnessed the history of this city. After that, we will return to Frankfurt.

[Goethe House]

This is where the famous German poet John Wolfgang Goethe was born (August 28, 1794). He spent his youth here, and wrote the famous "The Sorrows of Young Werther" and the beginning of "Faust".

[Source of justice]

At the coronation ceremony of Matthias in 1612, the fountain spewed wine. Frankfurt must visit attractions

[Rothenburg City Hall]

Dating back to the 14th century, the Gothic and Renaissance mixed-style towers offer sweeping views of the city and the Tauber Valley.

[St. Jacob's Cathedral]

It is the most important church in the city of Rothenburg, and the Gothic building was built in the 14th century. The church houses the Heilig Blut Altar, which depicts the last supper and is said to be dedicated to the Holy Blood of Christ.

[Rothenburg Wall]

It has a total length of 2.5 kilometers and is completely surrounded by Rothenburg. There are passages on the wall to walk, roofs to shelter from wind and rain, and more than 30 towers dotted with large and small.

[Roman Forum]

The Roman Forum in Frankfurt is the heart of the Old Town of Frankfurt, north of the River Main and home to the Old Town Hall. Built in the Middle Ages, the square was blown up during World War II and almost completely rebuilt after the war. It is now the only square in Frankfurt that still retains the streets of the Middle Ages, in contrast to modern Frankfurt.
