Tour Overview

Depart from Frankfurt in the morning and arrive in Zurich via Stuttgart. Zurich is the largest city in Switzerland and its economic and financial centre. In Zurich, find yourself marvelling at the historic buildings in the old town, explore the city's landmark: [the Grossmünster church]. Cross the Münsterbrücke bridge and you'll reach the [Fraumünster], with its famous stained glass windows by Marc Chagall. A walk through [Bahnhofstrasse] to [Lake Zurich] will round off your day of sight seeing nicely. Overnight in Bern or nearby.

Clock tower

[Bern Old Town]

Built in the 12th century on the hills surrounded by the Ahr River, it became the capital of Switzerland in 1848. The ancient city preserves the 16th century elegant arched promenade and fountain. In 1983, it was included in the World Heritage List by UNESCO.

[Clock tower]

The clock tower is also known as the city symbol of Bern. Originally built in the 13th century, this giant clock tower was originally the gateway to the city of Bern, and today this historic clock tower is one of the most famous cultural attractions in Bern's open public visit.

Opening hours: Tuesday - Sunday 10:00-17:00, closed on Monday. Free guided tour time: May 1st - November 1st every day 14:30-15:20, a total of 50 minutes.

Day 2 Fribourg 🚆 Zweisimmen 🚆 Montreux 🚆 Geneva



Tour Overview

After breakfast, we will head to Bern, the capital of Switzerland, and visit the [Old Town of Bern], which has been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Then, we will continue to Zweisimmen and take the [GoldenPass Express] to Montreux. The section of the railway between Zweisimmen and Montreux (MOB) is considered one of the most scenic parts of this route. Montreux is a picturesque lakeside town on the shores of Lake Geneva, renowned for its stunning views, vibrant cultural scene, and as the home of the famous Montreux Jazz Festival. And the [Chillon Castle] (optional), which we will visit, is one of Montreux's most famous landmarks. Overnight in or near Geneva.

[Château de Chillon]

In the long history, he has played different roles such as military fortresses, prisons, and summer palaces. The Chillon Castle, which stands in the Lake Geneva, is famous for the British poet Byron's famous Prisoner of Chillon.

[Olympic Museum]

The world's largest Olympic competition information center. Through art, literature, film, etc., we show people the history of the Olympic movement from ancient Greece to the present, combining sports, art and Olympic spirit and culture. The 3,400-square-meter exhibition hall features permanent and temporary exhibits with a unique style, and the museum is also an international custody and research center.

[Notre Dame Cathedral]

The Cathedral of Our Lady of Lausanne is also known as the "Lausanne Cathedral". The church was built in 1175 and completed in 1232. It was considered a sacred place by Pope Gregory X in 1275. After the 16th century, it has gradually become a new Christian church.

[Golden Pass Line Golden Pass Line]

The Golden Pass Express is a fascinating route connecting Lake Geneva, Lake Thun, Lake Brienz and Lake Lucerne with the most beautiful lakes in Switzerland. The Golden Mountain Express connects the ancient city of Lucerne in the German-speaking part of Central Switzerland and the elegant lakeside city of Montreux in the French-speaking southwest. Bright lakes, majestic Alps, laid-back ranch, beautiful vineyards – you can enjoy the colorful scenery.

The Golden Pass Express is a combination of MOB (Zweisimmen to Montreux), BLS (Interlaken to Zweisimmen) and Brunig (Luxembourg to Interlaken).

Day 3 Geneva 🚆 Lausanne 🚆 Zermatt



Tour Overview

After breakfast, we will head to Geneva, a global hub for diplomacy, where we will visit the [Palace of Nations] and enjoy the scenic beauty of [Lake Geneva]. Next, we will travel to Lausanne, a charming city on the shores of the lake, where we will explore the magnificent [Cathedral of Notre-Dame of Lausanne] and learn about the history of sports at the [Olympic Museum]. Afterward, we will continue to the small town of [Zermatt], a car-free mountain retreat that is famous for its stunning views and its reputation as the "Glacier City" (Train tickets are mandatory and must be paid for by visitors themselves). Overnight near Zermatt.

[Lake Geneva]

Lake Geneva is located in the largest lake in Western Europe – on the shores of the beautiful Lake Geneva. The blue sky reflects in the lake to form a picture of heaven and water, and it is also a world-wide international city where the world meets. If the weather is fine, see A large fountain with a water spray of up to 130 meters. Next, visit the United Nations' European headquarters in Geneva's most beautiful new square. From the new square, you can see the old town's high posts.

[Chamonix town]

It is world-famous at the foot of Mont Blanc, the highest peak of the Alps in Europe. It is the birthplace of modern mountaineering, suitable for hiking, skiing, rock climbing and rafting.

[Palais des Nations]

The Palais des Nations is the European headquarters of the United Nations, located on the shores of Lake Geneva on the northeastern outskirts of Geneva, facing the hustle and bustle of the Alps. The Palais des Nations is made up of 4 magnificent buildings surrounded by green trees and beautiful surroundings.

[Zermatt town]

Known as the "City of Glaciers", the town of Zermatt is located in the middle of the Alps and is a world-famous mountain-free tourist attraction. The environment is elegant and the air is fresh, with magnificent views of the mountains and glaciers.

Day 4 Zermatt 🚂 Jungfrauoch 🚂 Interlaken



Tour Overview

After breakfast, we go to Interlaken. A visit to Top of Europe—[Jungfrauoch](optional) puts a jewel in the crown of any visit to Switzerland. For more than 100 years, the Jungfrau railway has been making its journey to Europe's highest-altitude railway station at 3454 metres. All through the year, the cog railway runs steeply up through a tunnel to the Jungfrauoch from Kleine Scheidegg. One stop within the tunnel offers spectacular views onto the glacier world outside through windows in the Eiger North Face. Overnight in Interlaken or nearby.

[Jungfrauoch]

It is the highest peak in Europe and the most fascinating landscape in the Bernese Oberland. It is known as the "Queen of the Alps". Jungfrau is 4158 meters above sea level and 18 kilometers across the river. It is like a young girl, dressed in long hair, wrapped in silver, lying on the back between the clouds.

[Chapel Bridge]

Chapel Bridge is a covered wooden footbridge spanning the river Reuss diagonally in Lucerne. Named after the nearby St. Peter's Chapel, the bridge is unique in containing a number of interior paintings dating back to the 17th century, although many of them were destroyed along with a larger part of the centuries-old bridge in a 1993 fire. Subsequently restored, the Kapellbrücke is the oldest wooden covered bridge in Europe, as well as the world's oldest surviving truss bridge. It serves as the city's symbol and as one of Switzerland's main tourist attractions.

[Lion monument]

The dying Lusen lion is one of the most famous statues in the world, and the famous writer Mark Twain called it "the most tragic and touching statue in the world."

[Lake Lucerne]

Surrounded by beautiful mountains, it is the most diverse lake in Switzerland.

Day 5 Interlaken  Lungern  Lucerne



Tour Overview

After breakfast, we will visit the small town of [Lungern], located on the shores of Lake Lungern. This charming town is known for its picturesque scenery and the beautiful Gothic-style church that stands as its landmark. The stunning views of the surrounding mountains and lake will captivate you and leave a lasting impression. Next, head to Lucerne. Explore the historic [Chapel Bridge (Kapellbrücke)], a 14th-century covered wooden bridge with beautiful artwork and visit the moving [Lion Monument (Löwendenkmal)], a tribute to Swiss Guards who died during the French Revolution. Overnight in Lucerne or nearby.

[Zurich Cathedral]

The Zurich Cathedral is one of the three main churches in Zurich, Switzerland (the other two are the Cathedral of Our Lady of Zurich and St. Peter's Church). The church is located near the banks of the Limmat River. Today's church was built around 1100 and was unveiled around 1220. According to legend, the earliest church was created for Charlemagne. The Zurich Cathedral is a monastery church that competes with the Cathedral of Our Lady of Zurich across the Limmat River in the Middle Ages. Charlemagne's mount stumbled in front of the tombs of the main saints Felix and Regula in Zurich. According to legend, it was earlier than the Cathedral of Our Lady, which was built by the grandson of Charlemagne. Recent archaeological evidence proves that this is the Roman cemetery.

[Lake Zurich]

Lake Zurich is the famous icy lake in Switzerland. The scenery of Lake Zurich is superb, with medieval pebble trails along the river for visitors to take a walk by the lake, swimming, picnicking, sunbathing and boat trips to the Lake District.

[St. Gallen Cathedral]

A masterpiece of Baroque architecture rebuilt in the 18th century, the interior murals are beautifully decorated and listed as a world cultural heritage.

[St. Gallen Abbey]

Historical footprints can be seen in every corner of St. Gallen. The St. Gallen Women's Monastery and its Baroque cathedral are the landmarks of the city, and the monastery and its library and monastic archives were declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1983.
