[Hot spring corridor]

In the 19th century, in order to allow the tourists who came to cultivate to easily access the spring water, a special cloister was designed to connect more than a dozen hot spring outlets, and people could taste them one by one during a leisurely walk. The hot spring cloisters are mainly located on the right bank of the Tibola River. From the north to the south are the park hot spring cloister, the mill hot spring cloister, the market hot spring cloister, and the Vajdillo hot spring cloister.

[Pearson]

Pearson is a western Czech city. It is an important economic and cultural center. It is famous among the world's beer giants for the birthplace of Lager. It is known as the Fountain of Eternal Bubbles. Although Pearson is an uncompromising industrial city, it has a charming old town centred around the wide Nam Republiky Square, surrounded by rows of gardens.

[Hot spring town]

Karlovy Vary's reputation comes from the hot springs, one of Europe's most famous spa centres. There are 13 main fountains and more than 300 small fountains in the city. It is said that the spring water contains many beneficial minerals and can treat respiratory diseases. Many tourists will buy a special local small pot with a nozzle to taste the spring water. . Approaching the spring water, you will smell the smell of sulfur.

[Cesky Krumlov Castle]

The Krumlov Castle was built in the 13th century, the commanding heights of the town of Cita in the castle. Ascend the old castle, overlooking the town, the orange roof tiles, the patchwork roof, the towering church, the boundless green space, the winding river, the deep blue sky and the soft white clouds, dreamlike, beautiful People suffocate. Looking at the arched window, CK is like a painting, and you are the author of this painting.

[Budweiser Town]

Bujeovice is the capital of the Czech Republic of South Bohemia, the home of Budweiser, and the old town is full of wonderful Baroque architecture. Since the 13th century, the area has been known for brewing beer. Budweiser beer originated from it, so it is also known as Budweiser town. There is a charming medieval old town with a central square in the old town, surrounded by beautiful buildings of Baroque and Renaissance style. On both sides of the street are well-preserved medieval-style buildings that vary in shape and color but are coordinated.

[Krumlov inner city]

The inner city is the core part of Cesky Krumlov. The entire area was declared a national cultural monument in 1989 and was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1992.

[Lazebnický Bridge]

Lazebnický The bridge is the main thoroughfare from the gates of the old castle into the ancient city, connected to the south side of the castle of Rumlov. On the bridge, you can not only enjoy the performances of artists, but also the quiet water flow under the bridge and the picturesque scenery on both sides.

[Mirabell Garden]

The place where the famous 18th century Austrian music master Mozart was born. The museum displays the violins, xylophones and pianos used by Mozart during his lifetime, music scores, letters, and blueprints for stage plays designed by himself.

[Hallstatt town]

The small town of Hallstatt has a warm climate and is suitable for travel in all seasons. This lakeside town stands between steep slopes and jewel-like emerald lakes, with fairy-tale and beautiful homes.

[Austrian Parliament Building]

The Austrian Parliament Building in Vienna is the seat of the Austrian National Assembly and the Austrian Federal Parliament.

[Schonbrunn Palace]

The Schönbrunn Palace is named after a spring, which was originally an open green space. Once the Emperor Matthias had hunted for this, drinking a spring water and refreshing his heart, he called this spring a beautiful spring. In 1743, Queen Mary G. Teresia ordered the establishment of a palace here, where there were magnificent palaces and baroque gardens. It covers an area of 26,000 square meters, second only to the French Palace of Versailles, and is the second largest palace in Europe.

[Stephen's Cathedral]

Stephen's Cathedral is a symbol of the city of Vienna and one of the most famous Gothic churches in the world. Its 137-meter-tall minaret is the second tallest church spire in the world after Cologne Cathedral. The high dome, the baroque and elaborate altar, is unforgettable. Carved gorgeous marble columns. The magnificent building, with its colorful glass, makes people feel sacred. Visitors can also climb the South Tower of the Cathedral and take the elevator to see the Pomeran clock, which overlooks the city of Vienna.

[Hofburg Imperial Palace]

The Hofburg Imperial Palace is the palace of the Habsburg dynasty in Austria and is located in the heart of the capital, Vienna. From 1275 to 1913, after many reconstructions and reconstructions, it finally evolved into a maze of 18 wings, 19 courtyards and 2,500 rooms. In the six exhibition halls of the Princess Sissi Museum, there are a large number of replicas of the royal palace and some costumes, which can be used to trace the life of the Princess Sissi.

[Town Hall Square]

The Vienna City Hall is a very grand neo-gothic building and the residence of the Mayor of Vienna and the City Council. The city hall iron man at the top of the tower is one of the symbols of Vienna, and it also shows people's challenges to the old forces.

[Heroes Square]

Heroes' Square is the main square of Budapest, the capital of Hungary, at the end of Andrásy Avenue (listed as a World Heritage Site), adjacent to the city park. There are two important buildings around the square: the Museum of Fine Arts on the left and the Palace of Art on the right. The Serbian Embassy is also located here. At the heart of the Heroes' Square is the city's landmark, the Millennium Monument, engraved with seven tribal leaders who created Hungary in the 9th century, as well as statues of other Hungarian historical celebrities.

[Fisherman Bastion]

Fisherman's Bastion is a neo-Gothic and neo-Roman-style viewing platform located on the Castle Hill on the Danube River on the Buda side of Budapest, Hungary, near the Matthias Church. It was built between 1895 and 1902, and the designer was Frij Schuler during the Second World War, and the Fisherman's Bastion was almost destroyed. Between 1947 and 1948, the son of Frij Schulek, Janos Schuleck, was in charge of the restoration project. From the tower and the observation deck, you can see the Danube, Margaret Island, Pácel in the east, and the panoramic view of the Gellé Hills.

[Buda Castle]

Located on the west bank of the Danube on the Castle Hill in Budapest, it is one of Budapest's landmarks. It was once the residence of the Hungarian royal family. The central part of the palace has been changed to the Budapest History Museum, the National Library and the National Gallery. It is open to the public. .

[Matthias Church]

The Matthias Church is located along the Danube River on the Fisherman's Bastion side. The crowning of the Hungarian kings is one of the landmarks of Castle Hill. The bright colors, stone spires, colorful mosaic roofs, Hungarian folklore, Art Nouveau style and Turkish style are all fascinating against the blue sky. As described by Hugo, the Matthias Church is a "symphony of stone."

Afterward, head to Prague, the capital of the Czech Republic, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We'll discover the [Prague Castle](optional), which was home to the Czech kings and a symbol of the nation's rich history. Next, visit [St. Vitus Cathedral], an example of Gothic architecture located within the Prague Castle complex. Next, explore the [Golden Lane], named for the goldsmiths who once lived here, and [Charles Bridge]. Continue your exploration with a visit to [Old Town Square], the heart of Prague's historic center, where you'll find the famous [Prague Astronomical Clock].
