

[Black church]

The Black Church was built in 1383 and lasted for nearly 100 years. It was not completed until 1477. <u>The church</u> is 8 meters long, 38 meters wide and 65 meters high. The building is grand in scale, well-structured, sturdy and beautiful, and the walls are black with late <u>Gothic</u> architecture.

[Old Town Hall Square]

At the heart of the square is a yellow building with a dark brown roof, which is the old town hall. After a relatively large-scale renovation in 1420, some of the main local council meetings and citizen meetings were held here.

[Perez Castle]

Peres Castle is also recognized as the most beautiful place in Romania, and because of this wonderful royal summer palace, Sinaia is known as the

"Pearl of the Carpathian Mountains" . This majestic ancient palace was built in 1873 and was completed in 1914. The project lasted nearly 40 years. The castle is a typical Baroque architecture that reflects the German Renaissance style.

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

After the Romanian independence in 1878, it was changed to the current name. There are now shops, restaurants and cafes along the street, one of Bucharest's main shopping areas.

[Parliament palace]

The Bucharest Parliament Palace is located on the slopes of the southwestern part of Bucharest. It was originally called the People' s Palace and the Republic Palace. It was built during the reign of the former State Council of the Romanian Socialist Republic, Nikola Ceausescu. The House of Representatives, the Constitutional Court and some important organs. The architectural design and construction of the Palais des Congrès is done by the Romanians themselves. The building materials and furniture used are mostly produced in the country. Together with the 12-storey building, the Romanian superb architectural technology is regarded as the crystallization of the hard work and wisdom of the Romanian people and the world. One of the largest buildings in the upper body, and considered to be the greatest building of the country in the twentieth century.

[Veliko Tarnovo Castle]

The castle of Veliko Tarnovo is situated on the hills of the Tsarevets hill and Trapezitsa, and the Yantra River is in the meantime. Both castles are surrounded by mountains and walls, and the terrain is dangerous and easy to defend. In the Middle Ages, it was the second largest city in the Balkans after Constantinople. There are many monuments preserved.

Plovdiv Old Town [Plovdiv Roman Opera]

The theater is located in the south gate of Pucheng Old Town. It was built in the second century AD and was discovered by chance during a construction. The theater is entirely made of white marble and is surrounded by hills with 20 rows of marble seats from the bottom to the top. The stage is 3.1 meters high and has vivid marble statues on both sides. It is the best preserved ancient theater in Bulgaria. The theater can accommodate around 3,500 people and is now often used in a variety of performances.

[Plovdiv Old Town]

The old town is located on the hills of the city centre and has historically served as a castle for guards. It concentrates on the essence of the traditional architecture of the city, and it also occupies a very important position in the history of construction. Many narrow streets in the city still maintain an ancient style. The upper floors of the residential buildings are supported by diagonal arches, which are prominent and layered. Many residential houses have been turned into museums, and some have been named as national key cultural relics protection units.

The National Palace of Culture is located in the <u>Bulgarian</u> capital of <u>Sofia</u>. It was officially put into use in 1981 and is open to the public.
