[Cairo]

Cairo is the capital and largest city of Egypt, and also the largest city in Africa and the Arab world. The city is located at the southern end of the Nile Delta in northeastern Egypt, straddling the Nile River. It is majestic and spectacular, and is the political, economic, cultural, commercial and transportation center of the entire Middle East. Cairo consists of Cairo Governorate, Giza Governorate and Qalyub Governorate, commonly known as Greater Cairo. Cairo is one of the oldest cities in the world. It is also one of the few ancient cities in the world that has suffered the least damage from war. In Cairo, mosques and minarets can be seen everywhere. In Arabic, minarets are called "minars", which refer to the place where the muezzin stands and calls people to pray. Since the 7th century, with the widespread spread of Islam in West Asia and North Africa, the art of mosque architecture has continued to develop, and minarets have evolved into various styles, becoming an indispensable part of mosque architecture and a highlight of Cairo city.

Tour Overview

Today we will drive to the Mediterranean coastal city of Alexandria. Egypt's second-largest city and main port, locals call this vibrant city the Bride of the Mediterranean Sea. Our exploration begins at [Pompey's Pillar], which is a monumental column in Alexandria. From there, we'll proceed to the impressive [Qaitbay Citadel] – a 14th-century complex designed to defend Alexandria from the Ottoman empire, built on the site of the former Alexandria Lighthouse. In the afternoon, we'll admire the exterior of [Bibliotheca Alexandrina] and explore the expansive [Al-Montaza Palace Gardens]. These lush gardens surround the magnificent Montaza Palace, a royal masterpiece blending Islamic and Florentine architectural styles that now serves as Egypt's presidential guesthouse. Special information: Today's driving time is approximately 3 hours.

It is Egypt's largest seaport and the country's second largest city, a historic city, a summer resort on the Mediterranean coast, located in the western part of the Nile Delta, on the Mediterranean Sea, at the northernmost tip of Egypt. The city was built in 332 BC and was named after the occupation of Egypt by King Alexander of Macedonia. It is an ancient and medieval city. It was once the political, economic, cultural and Eastern-West trade center of the Mediterranean coast. There are many places of interest.

[Pompey's Pillar]

Pompey's Pillar (Arabic: عمود السواري, romanized: 'Amud El-Sawari) is a Roman triumphal column in Alexandria, Egypt. Despite its modern name, it was actually set up in honour of the Roman emperor Diocletian between 298–302 AD. The giant Corinthian column originally supported a colossal porphyry statue of the emperor in armour. It stands at the eastern side of the temenos of the Serapeum of Alexandria, which is now in ruins. It is the only ancient monument in Alexandria that is still standing in its original location.

[Citadel of Qaitbay (Lighthouse of Alexandria Ruins)]

The Citadel of Qaitbay (or the Fort of Qaitbay; Arabic: قلعة قايتباي) is a 15th-century defensive fortress located on the Mediterranean sea coast, in Alexandria, Egypt. It was built from 1477 to 1479 AD (882–884 AH) by Sultan Al-Ashraf Sayf al-Din Qa'it Bay. The Citadel is situated on the eastern side of the northern tip of Pharos Island at the mouth of the Eastern Harbour.

The Citadel is situated at the entrance of the eastern harbour on the eastern point of Pharos Island. It was erected on the site of the former Lighthouse of Alexandria, which was one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World. Many structural modifications were made to the lighthouse after the Arab conquest of Egypt, but the lighthouse continued to function for many centuries.

[Giza Pyramids]

The Giza Pyramid, one of the Seven Wonders of the World, is located in the suburbs of Cairo and consists mainly of the Great Pyramid, the Carmen Ula Pyramid, the Monkala Pyramid and the Great Sphinx.

[Egyptian Museum]

The Egyptian Museum was designed and built in 1858 in Phra, north of Cairo, by the famous French archaeologist Mariette, who was called the "Father of the Egyptian Museum" by the Egyptians. Located on the east bank of the Nile River, the museum is one of the world's famous museums. It was officially opened to the public in 1902 and houses many historical relics from the ancient Egyptian pharaoh era to the 6th century AD. It has a collection of more than 300,000 pieces of cultural relics, 63,000 of which are on display, accounting for about one-fifth of all cultural relics. Because this museum mainly collects cultural relics from the Pharaoh period, the Egyptians habitually call it the "Pharaoh Museum". Among them, the pure gold coffin and the golden mask of the Pharaoh's mummy in the exhibition room of Pharaoh Tutankhamun's tomb are the best of ancient Egyptian cultural relics.

[Sphinx]

The ancient Egyptian pharaoh Regidf built the monument to the Sphinx according to the portrait of his father, Hufu, and regarded his father as the sun god. This is also one of Regidoff's propaganda means, in order to restore people's fear of this dynasty. This image is 20 meters high, 57 meters long, and the minister is about five meters. He wears the "Nems" crown. The forehead is engraved with the "Kubola" (ie cobra: cobra) sacred embossed, the lower jaw has the emperor. The sign of the drooping long beard, one ear is more than two meters long.

[Khafre pyramid]

The Hafra Pyramid is a pyramid built by the fifth dynasty of Egypt, Havra. At the beginning of its construction, around the middle of the 26th century BC, it was 143.5 meters high, only 3.2 meters shorter than the Hufu pyramid, it is now 136.5 meters high, as high as the Khufu pyramid. At the beginning, its side length was 215.3 meters, now it is 210.5 meters, the tower wall slope is 52°20', which is steeper than the Khufu pyramid, and it is at the highest point of Giza, so it looks like it is better than the Khufu pyramid. high. There is a temple in front of the Hafra Museum, and the long causeway in front of the temple leads to the temple and the Sphinx in another valley.

Take a morning flight from Cairo to Egypt's southernmost city, Aswan (1.5 hours, departs 5 :00 AM - 1:00 PM), Upon arrival, proceed to your 5-star cruise ship to check in or store your luggage. Begin your day with a visit to the [Aswan High Dam], a monumental feat of modern engineering that tames the mighty Nile River. Later, take a boat trip(optional) to [Philae Temple] - dedicated to the goddess Isis. Enjoy a leisurely afternoon aboard your cruise ship, soaking in the serene Nile views. In the afternoon, you may join an optional excursion: Enjoy a scenic 20-30 minute boat ride downriver, then transfer to a camel for a short 5-10 minute ride to reach the Nubian Village, where you'll experience modern Nubian culture first-hand. Special information: Complimentary experience of Egypt's iconic Nile Felucca sailboat (typically motorized, not manual).

[Philae Temple]

The temple dates from 4th century BC but the Ptolomies and the Romans up to 3rd century AD built most of the existing structures. In danger of being completely submerged by the rising water of Lake Nasser, in 1972 UNESCO stepped in and an 8-year rescue effort was undertaken to relocate the entire temple 20m higher on nearby Agilika Island.

[Nile sailing]

This is a mode of transportation that has been passed down from ancient Egypt. This ancient white sailing boat has a special name, called Felucca. It can be said that Egypt is a symbolic feature besides the pyramid. It is coming to Egypt. One of the experiences that can't be missed.

[Aswan Dam]

The Aswan Dam is located on the main stream of the Nile River in Egypt. It is a large-scale comprehensive utilization water conservancy project near the Aswan City about 800km south of the capital Cairo. It has irrigation, power generation, flood control, shipping and tourism. , aquatic products and other benefits.

[Nubia]

Nubia is the name of the region between the first waterfall of the Nile in Egypt, Aswan, and the fourth waterfall in Kulimai, Sudan. The word Nubia comes from the gold (nub) in Egyptian. Generally, from Aswan to Wadi Halle, it is called Lower Nubia, and from Wadi Halle to Karima is called Upper Nubia. Sometimes the area between Qurei and Khartoum is also known as South Nubia. Since ancient times, Nubia has been the connection between Egypt and Black Africa, which is counted as the Mediterranean region.

Day 5 Aswan 🚢 Kom Ombo



Tour Overview

Enjoy a free morning in Aswan, perhaps visiting Abu Simbel(optional) where you' ll explore some magnificent temples. With the four colossal statues of Ramses guarding the Great Temple, carved directly from the mountain on the west bank of the Nile, this is one of Egypt's most memorable sights. After lunch on board your ship, you' ll set sail for your first stop – Kom Ombo. This second century BC complex is unique because it has a mirror-image design, divided down the middle, with either side dedicated to a different set of gods. One half is known as the Temple of Sobek (the crocodile-headed god of fertility) and the other half is dedicated to Haroeris (also known as Horus the falcon god), and the whole temple is full of fascinating reliefs. Special information: Abu Simbel trip from Aswan (290km/3.5hrs one way). Departs 4:30 AM, returns in 8-10 hours.

[Abu Simbel Temple]

The Temple of Abu Simbel (Arabic: أبو سمبل or أبو سنبل), located 290 km south of Aswan, Egypt, was built between 1300 and 1233 BC. It is said that the name comes from the earliest Westerners. The name of the on-site guide (a little boy). It is located on the west bank of Lake Nasser, consisting of a gated archway, a giant Ramses II cliff statue, a front and rear pillar hall and a shrine. Abu Simbel and many of its remains down to Philae Island are used as Nubian sites and are designated by UNESCO as World Heritage Sites.

[Koonpo Temple]

Located in the city of Koonpo, the Koonpo Temple has two very worthwhile patterns. The first pattern is Egypt, the oldest calendar in the history of the world, and the other is a tool for surgery more than 2,000 years ago .

Then, your ship will sail onwards to Luxor, passing through the [Esna Locks]. Ships often have to queue to proceed through the locks, a great opportunity to check out the process from deck, listening to the shouts of the many captains as they navigate their way through the various small boats of merchants selling their wares to a captive audience. Special information: Complimentary horse-drawn carriage night tour of Luxor (optional paid entry to Luxor Temple if open, with vehicle transfer back to the cruise ship)



Temple of Edfu

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[Temple of Edfu]

The Temple of Edfu (also known as the Temple of Horus) is an ancient Egyptian temple located in the city of Edfu on the west bank of the Nile River in Egypt. Situated on high ground, it is protected from the threat of flooding and is one of the best-preserved temples in Egypt. In addition to serving as a place of worship for the falcon-headed god Horus, the temple was also used for religious ceremonies. Furthermore, the inscriptions on the temple walls provide scholars with valuable information about ancient Egyptian language, mythology, and religion during the Greco-Roman period. Edfu is a major center for sugar production and pottery in Egypt and preserves a glimpse of ancient Egyptian civilization over thousands of years.

Tour Overview

This morning there is an optional activity of hot air balloon experience, where you'll float above Luxor for approximately one hour, witnessing the Nile River bathed in golden morning light while taking in aerial views of ancient marvels like the Valley of the Kings. Insurance included. Your first stop is the [Valley of the Kings]. Buried under the arid hills here are over 60 tombs of pharaohs, many richly decorated with reliefs and paintings. Continue to visit the [Temple of Queen Hatshepsut] – a colonnaded building set against high cliffs that create a spectacular natural amphitheatre. And the [Colossi of Memnon] – two 17-metre-high statues on Luxor's west bank. Afterwards, explore [Karnak Temple], one of the world's most celebrated temple complexes, Karnak is a house of the gods built over a period of some 2000 years. And view the beautiful [Temple of Luxor]. Special information: Luxor to Hurghada – approximately 320 km (4-hour drive)

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[Valley of the Kings]

The Valley of the Kings is located in a valley on the west bank of the Nile River opposite Luxor City. It is a tomb of many kings and royal members. It is home to 64 pharaohs from the 17th Dynasty to the 20th Dynasty, of which only 17 are open. . The largest one is the tomb of the 19th Dynasty Shati I. From the entrance to the last burial chamber, the horizontal distance is 210 meters, and the vertical distance is 45 meters. The huge rock cave is dug into an underground palace, and the walls and ceiling are covered with murals. The decor is gorgeous and unimaginable.

[Luxor Temple]

The Luxor Temple is a large ancient Egyptian temple complex located on the east bank of the Nile River in the city known today as Luxor (ancient Thebes), built around 1400 BC. In Egyptian, it is called ipet resyt, meaning "southern sanctuary." It is one of the two main temples on the east bank, the other being the Karnak Temple. Unlike other temples in Thebes, Luxor Temple does not honor evil deities or deified versions of deceased pharaohs; instead, it focuses on the revival of kingship and may have been the site for the

coronation of many pharaohs. The temple is dedicated to the Theban triad of gods: Amun, his consort Mut, and their son Khonsu. Each year, during the Opet Festival, the statue of Amun from the nearby Karnak Temple is paraded to the Nile River, where it stays for a time with his consort Mut, praying for the fertility of Amun-Ra and the pharaoh.

[Mengnong Colossus]

It is said that the one on the right side of the statue of Mengnong will make a far-reaching sound in the morning sunrise. Many travelers have recorded that they have heard a sad and melodious song. The ancient Greeks linked this phenomenon to the capture of the city of Troy. Scientists believe that it is natural, the sound appears due to the sudden change of temperature from cold to hot at sunrise, and the heat generated by the first sun ray in the morning passes through the body of the stone to make a sound of gold. Before the giant statue of Mengnong, not far from there is a vast field, green waves rolling, the two giant elephants are a door between history and present, between humanity and nature.

[Karnak Temple]

Founded more than 3,900 years ago, the Karnak Temple is located in the northern part of the Egyptian city of Luxor and is a spectacular temple left over from the ancient Egyptian Empire. There are more than 20 shrines, 134 giant stone pillars, and stone statues of lions and rams in the temple. The magnificent atmosphere is shocking. The Karnak Temple is part of the Middle Kingdom of Egypt and the capital of the New Kingdom, Thebes. The worship center of the sun god Amun God, the largest temple in ancient Egypt.

[Mortuary Temple of Hatshepsut]

Hatshepsut, one of the most prominent female pharaohs in ancient Egyptian history, ruled from 1479 to 1458 BCE during the Eighteenth Dynasty. Known for her political acumen and economic achievements, she is particularly notable for her unique approach to power. To solidify her authority, Hatshepsut often dressed in traditional male attire, even wearing a false beard, to assert her position as pharaoh.

Her mortuary temple, located at Deir el-Bahari, is a masterpiece of ancient Egyptian architecture that reflects her reverence for the divine and her own deification. The temple's design harmoniously blends nature and architecture, with grand colonnades and wide ramps creating a magnificent presence against the cliffs. Hatshepsut's reign not only brought economic prosperity but also fostered artistic and cultural development, making her a revered female leader in ancient Egyptian history.
