**[Al Hafiriya Palace]**

Discover an excellent example of Spanish Gothic art at the [Toledo Cathedral] and visit [Toledo Old Town]. Overnight stay in Toledo or nearby. Then drive to Salamanca or its surrounding hotels.

### **[Toledo Cathedral]**

The famous building in the ancient city, when the Cathedral of Toledo was preferred, the cathedral was built in 1226 and was not completed until the end of the 15th century, which lasted for hundreds of years. The huge, complex, exquisite and rich structure of the cathedral building decoration project is evident.

### **[Ancient city of Toledo]**

Toledo was governed by Arab Moors, Christianity, Judaism, Islam, and Romans, thus leaving a mark of different eras. The buildings in the city cover Gothic, Moorish, Baroque and neoclassical churches, and the monasteries, royal palaces, temples, city walls, stone bridges, and houses are well preserved. It is a living treasure house of multicultural art. In 1986, it was

awarded the title of "Human Cultural Heritage City" by the United Nations.

### **[Royal Palace of Madrid]**

Second only to the Palace of Versailles and Vienna's Schönbrunn Palace, the third largest palace in Europe. It is one of the most preserved and beautiful palaces in the world. The palace has a square structure and is magnificent. The palace houses numerous gold and silver utensils and paintings, porcelain, tapestries and other royal items. It is a representative cultural relic of Bourbon and is one of the best in the European palaces. Now, the palace has been turned into a museum for visitors to visit.

### **[Plaza Mayor]**

This square was built by Philip III in 1619 and has a unique square square. It is 128 meters in width and 94 meters in length and is surrounded by a 4-storey building. In the middle of the square is the equestrian statue of Philip III. After three years of construction, it experienced three fires and was rebuilt. It was completed in 1953 and formed what we now see.

### **[Puerta del Sol]**

Puerta del Sol is located in the centre of Madrid and is semi-circular with 10 streets extending radially outwards. The Security Bureau building is a prominent building in the square, a neoclassical palace-style building from the end of the 18th century. After its completion, it served as the central post office, army headquarters and political department of Madrid. Puerta del Sol is a historic square and a place that reflects the customs of Madrid.

### **[Grand Avenue]**

Gran Vía is a gorgeous upscale shopping street in the heart of the Spanish capital, Madrid, east of Alcalá (close to Cibeles Square) and west to Plaza de España. This lively street is one of the most important shopping areas in the city, with a large number of hotels and large cinemas, and is known for its large buildings.

### **[Plaza of Spain]**

A large square and popular tourist destination in the heart of Madrid, on the western end of Gran Vía. The Royal Palace of Madrid is not far from the south side of the square. At the center of the square is the Miguel de Cervantes monument, including the Cervantes stone carving above, the Don Quixote and the Sanctuary Pansha bronze statue in front, and the two statues representing Don Quixote's true love. Stone statues: the ordinary village of Aunta Rothenso and the beautiful Dulcinea Del Toboso.

### **[Real Madrid Stadium]**

The magical story of the Bernabeu Stadium makes the history of the stadium's Real Madrid team a natural success. It was named the best club of the century by FIFA in 2000. Forever superstars such as Stefano, Puskas, Butragueno, Ronaldo, Raul and Zidane are all on the sacred grassland of the Bernabeu, with its famous white stripes.

## Day 3 Salamanca 🚗 Porto



### Tour Overview

Depart in the morning for Porto, Portugal. Famous for its production of the eponymous port wine, the city has a diverse history shaped by the wine trade. Stroll through the narrow streets of the old town and arrive at [Ribeira Square]. From there, head to the quay and experience the charming medieval buildings. Follow this with a visit to the [Porto Cathedral], a great example of Romanesque architecture with Gothic influences, and the [Clérigos Tower], a striking Baroque bell tower. Overnight stay in or around Porto hotels.

### [Ribeira Square]

Ribeira da Ribeira (Portuguese: Praça da Ribeira) is a square in Porto, Portugal, located in the historical center of the city and part of this World Heritage project.

### [Pastor tower]

A typical 18th-century Baroque church with a beautiful facade, whether the top layer deliberately leaves a broken triangle different from other traditional buildings, or the garlands and shells carved on it, and the altars carved in colored marble in the church. Have something to watch.

If you want to take in all the sights of Porto' s old town, you have to climb the 76-meter-high priest' s tower.

### [Porto Cathedral]

Built in the 12th century, Porto Cathedral is a Romanesque church, but its architecture is both Gothic and Baroque. The frontal rose window and the cloister on the right side of the altar are Gothic, the gate and the altar itself is gorgeous. Baroque.

Finally, don' t miss the historic [Old Cathedral of Coimbra], a stunning example of Romanesque architecture. Overnight stay in or near Coimbra.

### **[Baroque Library - University of Coimbra]**

The Baroque Library - University of Coimbra is one of the oldest libraries in Europe and has a history of more than 700 years. It is a typical Baroque building. It is a gift from the 18th century King Joao V (John V), and is now a university library. The interior of the pavilion is extremely luxurious, grand and elegant. The roof is nearly 5 meters high and is divided into upper and lower floors. The house has an arch structure. The roof of the pavilion is decorated with various tapestries and tile paintings, reflecting the theme of religion, war and history.

### **[Coimbra Old Church]**

The old church of Coimbra is the only remaining Roman Catholic church in Portugal. But if you look closely, you will find that this Romanesque church is like a Renaissance style, Gothic, Romanesque or even Moorish art style, which is just a testament to the development of European history. #### **[Roca pt.]**

The westernmost point of the entire Eurasia. People built a lighthouse and a cross to the ocean on the cliffs of Cabo da Roca. On the tablet, there is a famous saying in Portuguese: "Onde a terra acaba eo mar começa". Cabo Roca has been rated by Internet users as one of the "50 most worthwhile places in the world."

#### **[Sintra Palace]**

The Sintra Palace is located in Sintra, near Lisbon, Portugal. It was built in John I and was not completed until the reign of Manuel I in the 16th century. The palace blends Moorish and West Gothic architecture, and its chimney is exceptionally eye-catching. The Royal Palace is the best-preserved medieval royal palace in Portugal. It was the king's summer palace before the establishment of the Republican system in Portugal. As part of the Sintra cultural landscape, it is listed as a World Heritage by UNESCO.

#### **[Sintra old district]**

Sintra is a municipality in the Lisbon region of Portugal, located in the foothills of the Sintra Mountains, 18 km from the Atlantic Ocean, a residential suburb close to Lisbon. The town has dotted royal estates and castles, many of which were completed between the 15th and 19th centuries.

Next, we'll visit [Torre de B elém] a cornerstone of Portuguese identity and an icon of a country historica lly shaped by its proximity to the ocean and its maritime discoveries of new worlds. Come and make your own discoveries at the [Padrão dos Descobrim entos], a monumental sculpture commemorating the golden age of Portugu ese history. Not far away, you will find one of the symbols of Lisbon the [25t h of April Bridge]. Overnight stay in Seville or nearby.

### [Jerónimo Monastery]

The Jerónimo Monastery was built more than 100 years after the heyday of Portugal and is the most magnificent and magnificent building in Portugal. The monastery is a perfect combination of Gothic and Renaissance. It is called the "treasure" of Manuel architecture in later generations and cannot be transcended and copied.

### [Belém Tower]

Belém Tower is both a testimony to the glorious history of Portugal and a famous landmark in Lisbon. Built in 1500, the tower is more like an old castle, built entirely of white marble. Together with the Jerónimo Monastery, it is rated as one of the world's cultural heritage and one of Portugal's seven wonders.

### [April 25th Bridge]

On April 25th the bridge spanned the Tejo River, connecting Lisbon with Almad, on the other side, with a total length of 2277.64 meters. When the bridge was opened to traffic on August 6, 1966, it was called Ponte Salazar. After the revolution, the Dianthus flower revolution was changed to the current name.

### [Nautical monument]

The nautical monument, located near the Belém Tower in Lisbon, was built to commemorate the 500th anniversary of the death of the navigator Henrique o Navegador (1394~1460). It is shaped like a ship with a giant sail. The monument is engraved with statues of Henry and 80 other sailors. The person standing on the bow is Henry, then his assistant is Gama, and on both sides are some voyagers who are accompanying the departure. The famous generals, missionaries and scientists in the history of Portugal are quite powerful in commemoration of Portugal's glorious history of pioneering the ocean for 300 years.

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**Tour Overview**

Next, head to Córdoba where you will visit several key landmarks: the [Roman Bridge], offering scenic views of the Guadalquivir River and the city. You will also explore [Alley of Flowers], a narrow street adorned with colorful flowerpots and typical Andalusian architecture. Finally, visit the [Córdoba Cathedral], a magnificent blend of Islamic and Christian architectural styles. Overnight stay in Cordoba.

### **[Plaza of Spain]**

Seville is a historical city. Its prosperity and decline have enriched the rise and fall of the Spanish Empire. The Plaza of Spain is the most easily confirmed building in Seville, the epitome of the Moorish renaissance architecture.

### **[Seville Cathedral]**

Cathedral of Vitoria, once the largest religious building in the Christian world, has been chosen as a World Heritage Site. The great navigator Columbus finally slept in Seville, and his coffin was buried in the Cathedral of Seville.

### **[Royal Palace of Seville]**

The Royal Palace of Seville is the oldest royal palace in Europe and was chosen as a World Heritage Site in 1987. The palace was built in the Middle Ages, first as a Moorish castle, and later a blend of Islamic, Christian and Gothic styles, reflecting the architectural style of the Andalucía region. In addition to the building, the palace's garden is also a mixture of Arabic and Gothic styles, which is very worth seeing. It is also the location of the palace garden of the Martel family in Dorn in the TV series "Game of Thrones".

### **[Ancient Roman Bridge in Cordoba]**

The Ancient Roman Bridge, as the name suggests, was built in the era of Roman occupation, supposedly 2,000 years ago; however, the bridge is no longer a relic of 2,000 years ago, but has been repaired and maintained through the generations, and it is said that only the 14th and 15th arches of the bridge are the original ones now.

### **[Baihua Lane]**

Baihua Lane and Jewish Street are in one place, one of the most typical streets in Corvado, the Flower Lane, and the Alley of the Signboards. Geranium is the most popular flower in Andalusia, and visitors can find many terraces filled with geraniums on the streets of Corvado.

### **[Cordoba Cathedral]**

Church of the Assumption of the Virgin of Cordoba, also known as the Cathedral of Cordoba or the Mosque of Cordoba. The building is part of the historic centre of Córdoba, a world heritage site. It was first built in 786 and is called the St. Wensheng Sanctuary. In 1238, after regaining the lost ground movement, the mosque was changed to the Roman Catholic Cathedral.

After visiting the Madonna of [Ermita de la Virgen de la Peña], you will end today's itinerary. Overnight in Granada or nearby.

### [Ronda Town]

The town of Ronda stands on the edge of the Tajo Gorge at an altitude of 100 meters. The city is full of white-walled houses with Spanish-style architecture, which is simple and elegant. The new bridge straddles the canyon and connects the new old town. It is very stylish but natural and harmonious. Here, from the oldest bullring and museum tour in Spain, it seems that you can see the epitome of the standing bullfighting that originated here.

### [Mijas]

The center of Mijas is a typical white Andalusian village. The winds of the Mediterranean Sea gently travel up through the coast of Mijas to this 400-meter-high mountain town, and soak the land with plenty of sunshine. The red tiles and white walls of the town, and the blue Mediterranean Sea in the distance, are cozy and wonderful. The original church of Our Lady of Pell is a natural rock building that has lasted for more than 400 years. Under the statue of the Virgin Mary, the streets look peaceful and serene. Mijas is a small town where you can experience the local specialty of "donkey carts" and browse through the artisanal stores in the alleys.

## Day 9 Granada 🚌 Valencia

After breakfast, head to Granada, a city with an unmistakably Moorish flavour, located in eastern Andalusia. You will visit the [Alhambra] (optional), a beautiful complex of buildings and gardens. The Alhambra, also known as the Red Fort, located in the Sierra Nevada mountains outside Granada. It was the largest political and aristocratic centre of the Moslem West. The palace grounds comprise beautiful rectangular courtyards and numerous fountains, as well as the Nasrid buildings that served as living quarters for the monarchs and their servants. Overnight in Valencia or nearby.

### [Municipal square]

Surrounded by green trees, Valencia's Municipal Plaza is surrounded by a large fountain with its distinctive architecture, neoclassical town hall and neo- Baroque post office.

### [Plaza de la Virgen]

The Plaza de la Virgen is one of the landmarks of the old town of La Seu. There are some small restaurants and cafés nearby, which is one of the places where local citizens can relax. There is a famous fountain statue on the square, the Fuente del Turia. Eight male statues surrounded by bronze statues represent the eight canals leading to the Turia River surrounding the Turia River.

### [City of Arts and Sciences]

It was designed by Valencia's designer Santiago Calatrava. Because of the flooding, the Doria River has already been led out of the city. The riverbed where the river is located has now become a park, sports field, concert hall, and is a good place for local residents to relax. The City of Arts and Sciences is a major project, including the Science Museum, Sea World, Opera House, and Parks.

Next, we will explore the [Casa Milà](optional), where every building, wrought-iron door, and balcony tells a unique story. We will then visit [Columbus Square] to experience the charm of the city. (Barcelona's drop-off address: the main SANTS station, Estimated Arrival time: 19:00. You can also choose any sightseeing spot to leave the group in advance.)

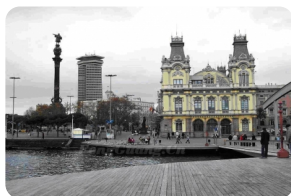

### [Park Guell]

Park Guell is one of the most dazzling sights in Barcelona and a masterpiece of garden design in Gaudi's many works. The artificial landscape here looks more natural than the natural landscape. The use of color and lines has also reached its peak. The entire city will be seen through the heights of the park.

### [Sagrada Familia]

Sacred House - Sagrada Familia, a church group consisting of many spires and towers, a masterpiece by Gaudi, a famous Catalan architect. Originally built in 1884, the slender lines are the main feature, and the dome and interior structure show neo-gothic style.

### [Mira House]

The Villa Mila was built between 1906 and 1912 in the Eixample extension of the city of Barcelona, Spain, on the Passeig de Gracia. The vault of the La Pedrera, in the shape of a parabola or catenary.

The La Pedrera is the last private residence designed by Gaudí and is often referred to as La Pedrera (Catalan, meaning "quarry" ). Three wavy walls, balcony railings made of twisted iron bars and iron plates, and large windows are very eye-catching. In 1986, the La Pedrera was bought by Caixa de Catalunya Bank and costly to renovate. The first floor is now the venue for the exhibition of the bank's foundation. The six-storey, top-floor and roof terraces of the Mira House are open to the public, and the chimneys on the roof are very special. On the balcony, you can also overlook some of the downtown streets and look at the Sagrada Familia.

### [Columbus Square]
