Tour Overview

[Mdina Old City], the stately town known as the Silent City, perches on its rocky promontory, its fortified bastions looming above the azure waters of the Mediterranean. Heading south, visit one of Malta's Three Blues—[Blue Grotto]. Take a boat trip(optional) to explore the mesmerizing depths of the Blue Grotto, a natural sea cave adorned with azure waters and captivating limestone formations. Next, travel north to the opposite coastline of Valletta to visit [Dingli Cliffs], known by locals as the place where the sky and sea meet as it's the highest point on the Maltese Islands. It offers stunning views of the Medit erranean Sea, the petite terraced fields, and the tiny uninhabited island of Filf la. Overnight in or near Valletta.

Three sister city

[St. John's Cathedral]

It is one of the main churches of the Catholic Church in Malta and a landmark of Valletta. It was built by the Knights of Malta from 1573 to 1578 and acquired the same status as the Archdish Church of Mdina at the beginning of the 19th century. From the outside, its khaki-coloured walls are not conspicuous, but the interior is heavily decorated with gorgeous Baroque styles, including staggered carved stone walls depicting the vaults and side altars of St. John's life scene. It is one of the most beautiful churches in Europe.

[Baraka Garden]

The Baraka Garden is the largest urban garden in Valletta, with up and down points. The Lower Baraka Garden is mainly a Roman-style marble temple. The Grand Baraka Garden above the Grand Harbour was originally a private garden of an Italian knight. It was incorporated into the urban defense system during the war and is now a public garden. The main viewing point of Leta. The garden has tall arcades and huge arched windows that are full of momentum. The viewing platform has an excellent view of Valletta, the Grand Harbour and the Three Sisters City.

[Old mint street]

There are many steep slopes in the city of Valletta, and the Old Mint is one of the most distinctive ones, even printed on postcards. If there is no such steep slope and a shadow in Valletta, it will always feel like something less.

[Three sister city]

The Three Sisters City is a small town of Senglea, Vittoriosa and Cospicua. This is the birthplace of the Maltese civilization compared to the capital, Valletta. Vittoriosa, formerly known as Birgu, is the most famous of the three sister cities. It is the main battlefield of the "Malta Mate" and the earliest habitat of the Knights of St. John in Malta.

Take a one-hour ferry to spend the day exploring Malta's garden island—[Go zo](optional). The coastline is spectacular with unique and stunning rock for mations lapped by the crystal-clear waters of the Mediterranean. In addition to the [Victoria Citadel], which offers breathtaking skyline views, Gozo is hom e to one of Malta's Three Blues—[Azure Window], a stunning limestone arc h. In 2017, heavy storms ravaged the island, causing the Azure Window to co llapse, leaving no visible rock above sea level.But still draws visitors from aro und the world. Afterward, visit [Comino Island](optional), a car-free oasis bet ween Malta and Gozo, renowned for its tranquil charm and the crystal-clear waters of the Blue Lagoon, one of Malta's Three Blues. Overnight in or near Valletta.
