Although it is located on the densely populated island of Great Britain, its population density is less than that of Sweden and Norway at similar latitudes.

#### [Eilean Donan Castle]

Scotland's Eilean Donan Fort is located in the Doni area of the Scottish Highlands and looks like a small island in the middle of the lake. It is Scotland's most famous castle. Its history dates back to 1220 AD, but the original structure of the castle was destroyed in 1719 and lasted for more than two centuries on the ruins. In 1919, Lieutenant Colonel John McRae Gilles Trapp bought it and began the restoration work, which was completed in 1932.

#### [Stowe Old Peak]

The Stone of the Old Man is one of the landmarks on the North Island of the Isle of Skye, a huge pointed rock on The Storr. It is named for the old man's head that looks like a sea. Along the long mountain road, visitors can stop from time to time to look at the sky and the sky in the distance, and feel what is called light and light. At sunset, watching the old man stone, the green hills, the black rocks, the blue waters and the vagaries of the flaming sky form an excellent landscape painting.

#### [Lealt waterfall]

Lealt Falls is located on the western edge of the Isle of Skye. Under the cliff, the icy waters set off huge waves in the wind, and the sound of the wind mixed with the waves rolling and squeaking, and watching the Lealt waterfall is best to stagger the windy season. Along the steep steps of the cliff, you can see the spectacular waterfall landscape: the mountain stream gathers into a raging stream of water, plunging from the cliff to form a waterfall. On a sunny day, at the waterfall, you can see the beautiful rainbow.

- ▲ [York Minster] £16/adult (1 child/youth under 16 years old can be brought for free) (closed to the public on December 25th every year, only for appearance tours), (if the road conditions are good, the group can arrive earlier Optional inside visit or free appearance)
- ▲ [Loch Ness Cruise (about 30 minutes) + Urquhart Castle tour ticket]: 30 pounds per person
- ▲ [Edinburgh Castle] To book tickets, it is recommended to consider the entry time between 13:30-15:00. It is recommended to visit for 30-60 minutes. Tickets are tight in the summer peak season.
