Enjoy a fascinati ng through-the-keyhole peek at the lavish State Apartments, home to pricel ess artworks by Rembrandt and Leonardo da Vinci, and visit St. George's Chapel, the atmospheric final resting place of former monarchs including He nry VIII. You can visit Queen Mary's Dolls' House, a truly incredible structu re complete with working lifts, running water, electricity and wine bottles, all in miniature! Mysterious Stonehenge The true meaning of this ancient, awe-i nspiring creation has been lost in the mists of time. Was Stonehenge a templ e for sun worship, a healing centre, a burial site or perhaps a huge calendar? How did our ancestors manage to carry the mighty stones from so far away a nd then, using only the most primitive of tools, build this amazing structure? Surrounded by mystery, Stonehenge never fails to impress. Bath Standing pr oudly on the slopes of the River Avon, beautiful Bath was the first city in Engl and to be designated an UNESCO World Heritage site. The gorgeous 15th ce ntury Bath Abbey, the stunning Georgian architecture, the romantic Pulteney Bridge, modeled on Florence's Ponte Vecchio, are all sights to linger on in th e memory of your day. Roman Baths and Pump Rooms No tour of Bath woul d be complete without a visit to the famous Roman Baths that gave the city i ts name. This beautifully preserved bathing complex still flows with water fro m Britain' s only hot spring. Marvel at the dazzling torch–lighting ceremony as dusk falls (not applicable in summer) and sip Bath's healing waters in the Pump Room, a stunning neo-classical salon. [Windsor Castle]

A Royal home and fortress for over 900 years, Windsor Castle, the largest occupied castle in the world, remains a working palace today. Windsor Castle is used regularly for Investitures at which honours recipients receive their medals from a member of the Royal Family in the Grand Reception Room.

[Roman Baths]

Bath is a city in Somerset, England, known for and named after its Romanbuilt baths. The city became a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1987, and was later added to the transnational World Heritage Site known as the "Great Spa Towns of Europe" in 2021. The city became a spa with the Latin name Aquae Sulis ("the waters of Sulis") c. 60 AD when the Romans built baths and a temple in the valley of the River Avon.

[Stonehenge]

Stonehenge is a prehistoric megalithic structure on Salisbury Plain in Wiltshire, England, two miles (3 km) west of Amesbury. It consists of an outer ring of vertical sarsen standing stones, each around 13 feet (4.0 m) high, seven feet (2.1 m) wide, and weighing around 25 tons, topped by connecting horizontal lintel stones, held in place with mortise and tenon joints, a feature unique among contemporary monuments.

[Shakespeare's Birthplace]

Shakespeare's Birthplace is a restored 16th-century half-timbered house situated on Henley Street, Stratford-upon-Avon, Warwickshire, England, where it is believed that William Shakespeare was born in 1564 and spent his childhood years. It is now a small museum open to the public and a popular visitor attraction, owned and managed by the Shakespeare Birthplace Trust.
