Tour Overview

After breakfast, we will visit Ljubljana. Crossing the magnificent [Dragon Brid ge], then experiencing local life at the market, visiting the ancient [St. Nichol as Cathedral], strolling through the old town and explore the famous Triple B ridge, with views of [Ljubljana Castle] in the distance. Next, we will head to [L ake Bled], which formed by glacial movements from the Alps, known for its s nowmelt, and it is referred as "Ice Lake". And we can take a boat ride on La ke Bled, enjoy views of [Bled Castle], and explore the island's church. Then we will head to Postojna and enjoy the [Postojna Cave], which is a marvelous place with many scenic spots and tunnels connecting the caves to form a magnificent cave corridor. Overnight in Postojna or nearby.

Dragon Bridge

[Lake Bled]

Bled is located in the Alpine region of northwestern Slovenia and is a famous resort lake in Slovenia. In this paradise on earth, the blue waters are backed by green hills, and the lovely islands are dotted with them. Together with the mysterious castles and distant mountains, they form a picture like a dream.

[Dragon Bridge]

The dragon's four corners are decorated with bronze dragon statues. The dragon as the mascot of Ljubljana is the highest rate of appearance in Ljubljana. The bridge was built in 1900-1901 and was the first reinforced concrete structure in Ljubljana. It was also one of the largest reinforced concrete bridges in Europe at the time. At first he was called Emperor Franz. Joseph I bridged the bridge, and the original design of the bridgehead should be a flying lion instead of a dragon, and the architect Danimatić from Dalmatia gave the appearance of the Art Nouveau style of Long Bridge.

Day 3 Postojna ■ Zagreb

After breakfast, we will head to Croatia's capital, Zagreb, where we can admir e the Gothic architecture of the [Zagreb Cathedral], the tallest building in Croatia, and visit [St. Mark's Church], famous for its vibrant, colorful tiled roof de picting the coats of arms of Croatia, Dalmatia, and Slavonia, located in St. Mark's Square. Additionally, we can enjoy the views from the Kula Lotrščak, which overlooks the old town. Overnight stay in Zagreb or nearby.

[Assumption Cathedral (Zagreb Cathedral)]

The Assumption Cathedral, located in the heart of the Croatian capital of Zagreb, was destroyed in the 1880 earthquake and later rebuilt in 1899. The ruins include 13th-century frescoes, Renaissance backrest benches, marble altars and Baroque-style pulpit.

[St. Marks Cathedral]

Located on St. Mark's Square, St. Mark's Church in Zagreb is a Gothic building with a beautiful tiled roof. Located in the heart of St. Mark's Square, it was built in the 13th century. The interior of the church is beautifully carved and has different shapes. The eastern side of St. Mark's Square is the Croatian Parliament and the west side is the seat of the Croatian government. The work of the famous Croatian sculptor Meštrovich is displayed in the church.

Afterward, we will visit the histor ic city of Zadar, starting at the [Zadar City Gate], where you can feel the echo es of the city's past prosperity. Then, visit the [Church of St. Donatus], witne st the grandeur of Zadar's Roman history. Finally, experience the modern a nd experimental [Sea Organ], an innovative musical instrument that uses the power of the sea to create unique sounds, blending nature with art. Overnight stay in Zadar or nearby.

[Plitvice Lakes National Park]

The most desirable lake, waterfall and wildlife habitat in Europe - Plitvice is known as the Plitvice Lakes National Park because of its main 16 lakes. Whether it is scenery or geological origin, the Plitvice Lakes group is very similar to Jiuzhaigou in China, so in China, it is often referred to as "European Jiuzhaigou". The waterfall with the largest drop here is nearly 200 meters, and the smallest drop is only 2 meters. I don't know if it is the smallest waterfall in the world. Unlike the famous Great Falls, the rush is not a feature of the Plitvice Lakes waterfall. The feminine and quietness created by silk silk is the special feature here.

[Sea organ]

The world's unique sea organ, built in 2005, is a group of 70-meter-long waterfall ladders leading to the sea. It is equipped with 35 pipes of different caliber sizes and different slopes, which are issued by the impact of sea breeze and waves. sound. The unique Zalda "sea organ" in the world. The principle of vocalization is to place the music tube under the marble steps on the seashore, and use the movement of the waves to exert pressure on the air inside the tube to make a sound. Therefore, the player of the sea organ is a wave, it is nature.

Day 5 Zadar ■ Split ■ Dubrovnik

Tour Overview

After breakfast, we will head to Split, where we will visit [Republic Square], a vibrant public space surrounded by historic buildings. Then, we will explore the impressive [Diocletian's Palace] (Included in the price), a UNESCO World Heritage site and one of the most well-preserved Roman monuments in the world, which once served as the retirement residence of the Roman emperor Diocletian. The tour also includes a visit to the [Church of St. Domnius], located within the palace complex, a stunning example of early Christian architecture. Overnight stay in Dubrovnik or nearby.







Republic Square

[Diocletian Palace]

The Diocletian's Palace is one of the most famous historical buildings in Split and one of the most important and preserved historical monuments on the Adriatic coastline. It is also preserved in the Mediterranean, Europe and the world. The most complete ruins of ancient Roman palaces, there are a large number of tourists visiting here every year. Established by the ancient Roman Emperor Diocletian in the early fourth century AD, it was the palace where Diocletian first retired and then supported the elderly. Residents in the vicinity of the city have come here to escape from the war and have carried out the necessary commercial trade. So far, there are still many restaurants and shops in the palace.

[Republic Square]

From 1420 to 1797, the Venetian ruled here for 377 years. Influenced by the Venetians, the layout of this square is exactly the same as that of Venice's Marco Polo Square. The square is lined with new Renaissance-style terraces. An open-air concert is held every summer.

Then, marvel at the [City Walls of Dubrovnik], a remarkable defensive structure offering stunning views of the Old Town and the shimmering Adriatic Sea. Overnight stay in Dubrovnik or nearby.

The Dubrovnik Walls are defensive stone walls that surround the Old City. They have stood in the south of Croatia since the 7th century and are considered to be one of the greatest defense systems of the Middle Ages and have never been destroyed by the enemy. In 1979, the Old City of Dubrovnik and a large part of the city wall were included in the World Cultural Heritage List by UNESCO. Stroll through the walls of the Old Town and enjoy the perfect view.

[Banje Beach]

Banje Beach is Dubrovnik's most famous beach, offering an excellent view of the old city walls and Lokrum Island, attracting visitors from all over the world. Walking on the cobbled beaches, the crystal clear water gently touches your feet, the beach is very suitable for sports, and the bar street next to it attracts young people to stop.

Day 7 Dubrovnik ■ Mostar ■ Sarajevo

Tour Overview

After breakfast, depart for Mostar to visit the [Stari Most (Old Bridge)], a brid ge that spans the Neretva River, renowned for its historical and architectural significance. Explore the charming old town of Mostar, known for its cobbled streets, traditional shops, and vibrant atmosphere. Next, head to Sarajevo, the capital of Bosnia and Herzegovina. Visit the [Gazi Husrev-beg Mosque], on e of the most important and well-preserved examples of Ottoman architecture in the city. Then, see the [Sarajevo Clock Tower], which is a significant symbol of Sarajevo' s history. Finally, visit the [Latin Bridge], famous for being the site where Archduke Franz Ferdinand of Austria was assassinated in 1914, an event that contributed to the start of World War I. Overnight stay in Sarajevo or nearby.

[Mostar Bridge]

The Mostar Bridge is a 16th-century bridge in the ancient city of Mostar in the southern part of Bosnia and Herzegovina. It is also known as the inner river of the Neretva, which is also known for its beautiful curvature and magnificent form. Rainbow over the river Leteva. The stone bridge was first built by Turkish architects in 1566. It was blown up during the Bosnian War on November 9, 1993, and became a permanent testimony of racial hatred. Since then, under the assistance of international organizations and many countries, the ancient bridge that has been restored and rebuilt for three years was reopened on July 23, 2004, and many buildings around the ancient bridge were also restored. Due to the heavy history of the city and the meaning of the bridge itself, the reconstructed ancient bridge is regarded as a symbol of coordinated reconciliation and international cooperation, and has also been placed on the hope of harmonious coexistence among different cultures, races and religious societies.

[Sarajevo Grand Mosque]

Located in the heart of the old city of Sarajevo, it was built by Gazi Husrev Bey, who was then the governor of the Ottoman Empire in Bosnia. It was built in 1531 and was carried out in the 1990s due to damage during the civil war. The reconstruction work is now the largest and most important historical building and Islamic religious center in Bosnia and Herzegovina. There are mausoleums in the temple, and many great figures in the history of Bosnia have been sleeping here.

Day 8 Sarajevo ■ Belgrade

Tour Overview

After breakfast, head to visit [the site of the former Chinese Embassy in Belgr ade], which was bombed by the United States in 1999 during the NATO bom bing of Yugoslavia. The site serves as a powerful reminder of the events during that conflict. Next, visit the [Kalemegdan Fortress], which offers a stunning panoramic view of the confluence of the Sava and Danube Rivers. A fterward, take a stroll along [Knez Mihailova Street], the city's main pedestrian zone, visit [Saint Sava Temple], one of the largest Orthodox churches in the world. Finally, pay a visit to [Tito's Mausoleum] (House of Flowers), the resting place of Josip Broz Tito, the former leader of Yugoslavia.

Kalemegdan castle

Tito's tomb is also called "flower house". It is the cemetery of the famous leader of the southern federation, Tito. The reason why it is called "flower house" is because the periphery of the tomb has been surrounded by flowers, but now, next to the tomb is surrounded by White rock. Tito's full name, Joseph Broz Tito, was born on May 25, 1892 in the village of Kumrovets, Croatia.

[Kalemegdan castle]

Kalemegdan Castle is both a castle and a park. It is the best testimony of history and the iconic attraction and leisure destination of Belgrade. The main body of Kalemegdan Castle was built in the 17th century, but there are also some medieval gates, Islamic-style graves and Turkish baths.

Kalemegdan Castle is divided into four sections, namely Lower Town, Upper Town, Little Kalemegdan and Grand Kalemegdan. Each part has its own characteristics and is very ornamental.

Petrovaradin Fortress

[Petrovaradin Fortress]

Petrovaradin Fortress is a fortress in the town of Petrovaradin, itself part of the City of Novi Sad, Serbia. It is located on the right bank of the Danube river. The cornerstone of the present-day southern part of the fortress was laid on 18 October 1692 by Charles Eugène de Croÿ. Petrovaradin Fortress has many tunnels as well as over 16 kilometres (9.9 mi) of preserved underground corridors and countermine system. In 1991 Petrovaradin Fortress was added to Spatial Cultural-Historical Units of Great Importance list of the Republic of Serbia.
