[Mirabell Garden]

This baroque garden with Roman sculptures, fountains, gardens and labyrinths was once the place where the heroine Maria took the children to sing "Do-Re-Mi" in the famous film "The Voice of Music".

[Mozart House]

The place where the famous 18th century Austrian music master Mozart was born. The museum displays the violins, xylophones and pianos used by Mozart during his lifetime, music scores, letters, and blueprints for stage plays designed by himself.

[Meiqinggen Famous Village]

The success of the famous Metzingen Village originated from the old brick factory of the Canal Street in the 1970s: the textile center and the home of Hugo Boss. Day 2 Salzburg Vienna



Tour Overview

We'll explore the imperial summer residence of [Schönbrunn Palace](optional) and [Austrian Parliament], symbolizing Austria's political history. Next, we'll visit [Stephansdom], known for its striking tiled roof and panoramic views of the city from the tower, and [Hofburg Palace], housing the offices of the Austrian president and various museums. Overnight stay in Vienna or nearby.

[Austrian Parliament Building]

The Austrian Parliament Building in Vienna is the seat of the Austrian National Assembly and the Austrian Federal Parliament.

[Schonbrunn Palace]

The Schönbrunn Palace is named after a spring, which was originally an open green space. Once the Emperor Matthias had hunt for this, drinking a spring water and refreshing his heart, he called this spring a beautiful spring. In 1743, Queen Mary G. Teresia ordered the establishment of a palace here, where there were magnificent palaces and baroque gardens. It covers an area of 26,000 square meters, second only to the French Palace of Versailles, and is the second largest palace in Europe.

[Stephen's Cathedral]

Stephen's Cathedral is a symbol of the city of Vienna and one of the most famous Gothic churches in the world. Its 137-meter-tall minaret is the second tallest church spire in the world after Cologne Cathedral. The high dome, the baroque and elaborate altar, is unforgettable. Carved gorgeous marble columns. The magnificent building, with its colorful glass, makes people feel sacred. Visitors can also climb the South Tower of the Cathedral and take the elevator to see the Pomeran clock, which overlooks the city of Vienna.

[Hofburg Imperial Palace]

The Hofburg Imperial Palace is the palace of the Habsburg dynasty in Austria and is located in the heart of the capital, Vienna. From 1275 to 1913, after many reconstructions and reconstructions, it finally evolved into a maze of 18 wings, 19 courtyards and 2,500 rooms. In the six exhibition halls of the Princess Sissi Museum, there are a large number of replicas of the royal palace and some costumes, which can be used to trace the life of the Princess Sissi.

Continue with a visit to the [Fisherman's Bastion], an iconic terrace offering panoramic views of the city. We will also see the [Buda Castle], a former royal residence, and the [Matthias Church], renowned for its stunning architecture and vibrant history. Overnight stay in Budapest or nearby.

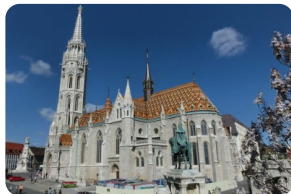

[Heroes Square]

Heroes' Square is the main square of Budapest, the capital of Hungary, at the end of Andrásy Avenue (listed as a World Heritage Site), adjacent to the city park. There are two important buildings around the square: the Museum of Fine Arts on the left and the Palace of Art on the right. The Serbian Embassy is also located here. At the heart of the Heroes' Square is the city's landmark, the Millennium Monument, engraved with seven tribal leaders who created Hungary in the 9th century, as well as statues of other Hungarian historical celebrities.

[Fisherman Bastion]

Fisherman's Bastion is a neo-Gothic and neo-Roman-style viewing platform located on the Castle Hill on the Danube River on the Buda side of Budapest, Hungary, near the Matthias Church. It was built between 1895 and 1902, and the designer was Frij Schuler during the Second World War, and the Fisherman's Bastion was almost destroyed. Between 1947 and 1948, the son of Frij Schulek, Janos Schuleck, was in charge of the restoration project. From the tower and the observation deck, you can see the Danube, Margaret Island, Pace in the east, and the panoramic view of the Gellé Hills.

[Buda Castle]

Located on the west bank of the Danube on the Castle Hill in Budapest, it is one of Budapest's landmarks. It was once the residence of the Hungarian royal family. The central part of the palace has been changed to the Budapest History Museum, the National Library and the National Gallery. It is open to the public. .

[Matthias Church]

The Matthias Church is located along the Danube River on the Fisherman's Bastion side. The crowning of the Hungarian kings is one of the landmarks of Castle Hill. The bright colors, stone spires, colorful mosaic roofs, Hungarian folklore, Art Nouveau style and Turkish style are all fascinating against the blue sky. As described by Hugo, the Matthias Church is a "symphony of stone."

[Prague Square]

Prague is the capital of the Czech Republic and one of the most beautiful cities in Europe. Its most famous square is the Old Town Square. The center of the Old Town Square is the statue of Jan Hus. The most distinctive ancient building in the square is the self-timer. The name Prague is from German. It is called Braha, which means "threshold" . The reason is that the Vltava River flows through a reef, and the water is rushing, just like crossing a threshold.

[Roland Fountain]

The Roland Fountain and the square in the center of the old town of Bratislava were built around 1572 to celebrate the coronation of the Maximilian King.

[Prague Astronomical Clock]

On the south wall of the old town hall, the astronomical clock gathers visitors from all over the world to stop and take photos to look at the clock that has been around for more than 600 years. The shape of the whole clock is very beautiful, according to the principle of the Earth Center of the year. The clock above circled around the day, the following year rounded around the week, every day at 12 noon, on the astronomical clock, the twelve beautiful Jesus disciples appeared in order from the side of the clock, six turned left, six Turn right. With a roar of the rooster, the window closes and the clock sounds.

[St. Vitus Cathedral]

The Katedrál sv. Víta is located in the Prague Castle on the west bank of the Vltava River and is one of the most important landmarks of Prague Castle. The outer walls of the west facades of the two new Gothic spires, which are 82 meters high, have been baptized by the years, but they are like a stalwart, but the ceremonies are still there. St. Vitus Cathedral is also known for its beautiful stained glass windows. If you are lucky, you can see the sun shining through the window into the church, sprinkling a colorful halo.

[Charles Bridge]

Across the Vltava River, the Charles Bridge connects the Prague Castle and the Old Town at both ends. Although the mighty scenes of the medieval knights crossing the bridge no longer exist, for the tourists who come here, it is enough to stroll on the bridge and let them surrender and surrender in the history of the earth. They are deeply satisfied.

[Prague Castle]

Prague Castle is located on the hills of the Vltava River in the Czech Republic, at the commanding heights of the entire city. From Prague Castle, you can enjoy panoramic views of the entire city. Whenever sunset, the colorful sunset glows on the bright red roofs of Prague, forming a fascinating ink painting that is absolutely amazing!

[Golden alley]

Located in the Prague Castle, Zlatá ulička is a protected medieval-style alley. The street name is derived from the 16th century alchemists, who say they want to refine gold here. The whole street is quite delicate and lovely, with a fairytale look and soft tones, small doors and windows, low roofs and many chimneys are very popular with tourists. The famous Czech Jewish writer Kafka rented for two years in the 22nd apartment on this street because there is a quiet writing environment.
